Trailers discussed at council

Trailers and mobile homes came under intense discussion at Erin Township council meeting Monday night.
A section of the by-law has been changed, effective Jan. 1, 1979. In the former way the township could regulate, prohibit non-conforming trailers, and license them if on the property 60 days or more. It has now been transferred to the planning act.
The first category is: Trailers for trailer parks. They can't be restricted, but can be regulated, and there would have to be an official plan change and zone change.
The second category is: Single owned lots for single trailers. These constitute a residence, and have to conform to the zoning by-law, and if restricted the law would be enforced.
Mobile homes, section of homes, do conform to the building code, but have to come to the terms of 1200 square feet. That is a status of legislation, and there is no distinction made now between mobile homes and houses. They are assessed the same, but they cannot be put on the land as a second house. They have to meet the Ontario building code.
John Salmon spoke to council later in the meeting on the trailer problem in the township. The official plan states that no trailers or mobile homes be dwellings on one lot. A definition of a mobile home or trailer was given as "any portable dwelling on jacks or wheels having no foundation, and used for living purposes."
David Heaslip on Lot 7 of the Ninth line, has 160 acres and about 220 sheep, besides other animals, and asked permission of council to put a trailer on the farm for hired help. He is prepared to enter into an agreement with the township that it is strictly used for providing a residence for hired help, and will be set back in the area of the barn. A letter will also be sent to the neighbors informing them of the intentions.
The building inspector reported that 50 building permits have been issued this year.
The contract has been let to Personal Lawn Care for ground maintenance in Erin Township at \$1680. Grass is to be cut twice each month.
Council agreed to allow a storage shed to be erected on Lot 23, Concession 10. There is no residence on the lot.
George Grundy applied for a separation of his house from the business. The OMB hearing will be July 23 at 10 a.m. in Guelph.
The Credit Valley Conservation Authority invited council members on a tour of the watershed to commemorate their 25th anniversary.
Kennedy's Flags wants a spot zone change from agriculture to manufacturing. Councillor Jo Schneider requested a double-check on that to see that things conform, to make sure Kennedy Flags know the situation and what it means.
Don McMurchy will be compensated \$200. for damaged cattle, and Dave Heaslip \$100 for an injured ewe that had to be destroyed.
Don Robertson and Edward Barber appeared to request a bylaw to rezone a portion of Lot 23, Concession 8, to permit residential use, and permission to build five houses on the five lots, on the Barber estate. After much controversy by Root and Armstrong on the close proximity of the barn to the proposed houses, motion was passed to permit the bylaw to be amended. All neighbors will have a chance to object within 21 days. The property is in the hamlet of Hillsburgh, and everyone who buys a house will know the barn is there. Councillor Schneider spent considerable time on questions, some of them directed to Deputy Reeve John Reid concerning the Guelph and Suburban Planning Board. She was concerned with the report that they were wanting to drop the name of hamlet from Crewson's Corners, Orton and Brisbane. Reid explained that hamlets like Hillsburgh and Rockwood have a growth potential which the others have not, and they shouldn't be classed in the same category. He felt if they were left on as hamlets they should be classified differently.
Schneider also brought a request from Ballinafad Recreation Board asking for a donation for Canada Day, to be held July 1. Reeve Wheeler replied they gave them a donation last year because they needed the money to get them started, and now, like Hillsburgh, they should be able to carry on their own.
Concerning the annexation of land by Erin Village, there has been some problem with taxes on land that has been previously annexed. Council has no objection to annexation of the strip of land north of the village for \$1000 if compensated for back taxes from previous annexation, and that Erin village will not hinder any development on the strip of roadway connecting 17 sideroad.
Cox Construction tender was accepted to supply, crush and deliver 40,000 ton of 5/8 crushed gravel at \$1.79 per ton.
