

Noise, traffic are nuisance

Truck noise, traffic and dust continue from the Dolmers' RR2 Guelph property, neighbors say. They questioned Eramosa township council's future action on the problem at Monday's session.

A June 3 Ontario Municipal Board zoning hearing upheld the Dolmer property zoning as agricultural rather than highway commercial. Dolmers had requested a zone change

to operate a vehicle repair business from the site.

By-Law enforcement officer John Salmon has issued a cease and desist order. If this is not adhered to, charges will have to be issued. Deputy Reeve David Masson informed the delegation.

Initiation of a civil nuisance action against Dolmers would be an alternate route to take in dealing with the problem. Mr. Salmon told the complaining neighbors.

New van ok'ed for firefighters

Eramosa-Rockwood Fire Department is updating its service vehicles. Township Council authorized purchase of a \$8577 Dodge Emergency Salvage Van at the June 18 session.

The larger van replaces the present 1973 model, judged too small for all necessary equipment by Chief Carl Meadows.

Remodelling costs for the 1973 vehicle placed its total value at \$7,000, just about \$1,500 below the brand new model's price, said Chief Meadows.

Roads Superintendent Bob Hamilton suggested

council consider using the retiring fire dept. van to carry equipment for Rockwood's water and sewer service.

Chief Meadows gave two weeks advance tender notice to seven area auto dealerships. Only one tender replied, he said.

Rockwood takes home hardware

Rockwood Centennial's track and field team triumphed at the Wellington County District Meet, last Wednesday at Guelph Centennial Collegiate. The team cinched top spot, outdistancing second place Eramosa Public School by 69 points.

Rockwood brought back all but one division championship. The Junior Boys and Girls, Intermediate Boys and Girls, and Senior Girls titles are theirs.

Eleven meet records were broken, four by Rockwood athletes.

Junior girl Carol Meadows established two records, jumping 3.76 metres in the running long and finishing the 100 metre dash in 15.5 seconds.

Senior girls Lila Noble ran the 100 metres in a record shattering 14.6 seconds. Junior Boy Kenny Phillips hit the

finish line in 32.65 seconds, setting a record.

Several Rockwood athletes turned in outstanding performances. Six students achieved a perfect 15, finishing first in all three events entered.
