The Martyrdom of the Bab

Mirza Ali Mohammad, known as The Bab for "The Gate", was martyred before 750 rifles in Tabriz, Iran, on July 9, 1850. Six years before, He had arisen to proclaim that He was the One foretold by all the religions of the world, and that He was the Herald of One far greater than Himself. The beauty of His teachings and the holiness of His life exposed the hypocrisy of most of the clergy of that time, and His popularity threatened their authority, so they arose fiercely to destroy Him. 20,000 of His supporters followed Him to their deaths within 20 years of His first proclamation.

The One whom He foretold was Baha'ullah, from whom the Baha' Faith derives its name. Baha'is commemorate the anniversary of the Bab's martyrdom on July 9 annually.
