### Council not satisfied with **MTC** evaluation

Minister of Transportation and Communication Snow's evaluation of hazardous winter driving conditions along Hwy. 24, in the Guelph dam

vicinity, has not satisfied township Eramosa council. Nor has the MTC's remedies to the problem.

The Stratford District maintenance personnel judged the area no different than many of the highly agricultural wide open areas across South western Ontario Wind and blowing snow conditions produce localized turbulence and "whiteouts" on hundreds of miles of provincial highway, said Mr. Snow's

letter to council. Snow fencing in key areas and selective tree planting by GRCA along the reservoir bank are remedial measures to be taken, he said.

Council requested to be included in an upcoming meeting with district maintenance staff and the GRCA regarding the

Council also restated its stand to Mr. Snow. The hazardous winter driving conditions did not exist before the Hwy. 24 realignment and Guelph dam construction. "The problem is caused by evolution of that facility and we want remedies to it," Reeve Bill Addsett
