

Planning changes reduce OMB appeals

Changes in the Planning Act proposed in a White Paper put forward by the Ontario government would cut out appeals to the Cabinet, on Ontario Municipal decisions and cut down on all appeals to the OMB.

The OMB would have discretionary powers to decide in advance whether or not there will be a hearing, according to the White Paper which seeks to eliminate frivolous appeals.

A major change could be the elimination of committees of adjustment and land severance committees. The regional council may approve severances or delegate a committee of council, or set up a land division committee as exists now, or appoint a municipal official to do so.

On the local council level the same would apply to the committee of adjustments. This could result in more control of both committees by regional and local councils.

Another major change proposed would give regional councils the official plans. power of approval of

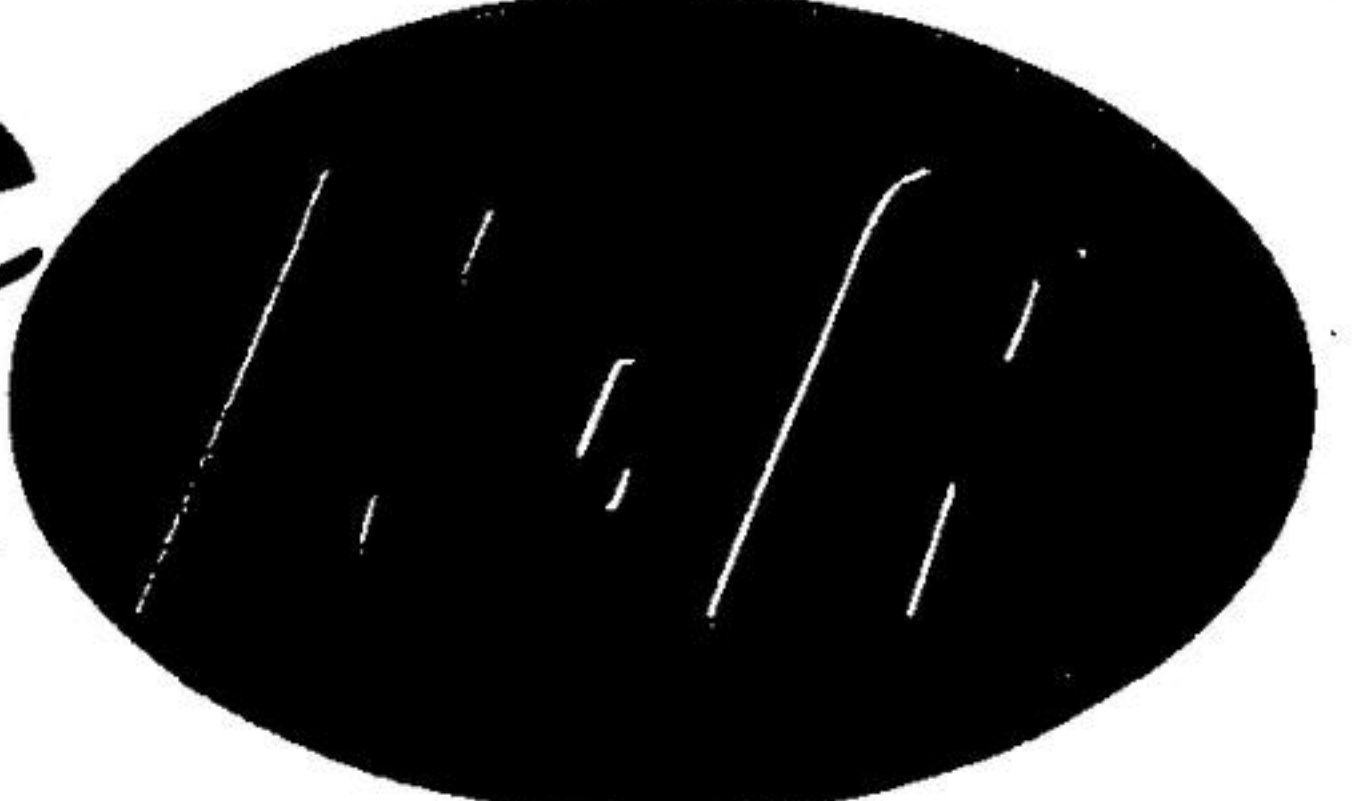
