Trying to dispell myths

Study volunteers

Beth Newell will be spending her summer trying to dispel "a myth" that all community volunteers are women and housewives.
 The 22-year-old Carlisle resident will spend the next eight weeks organizing and researching a project which will study the work of volunteers in the Milton, Georgetown and Acton areas.
 The project will attempt to cover volunteerism on the whole and although it will not limit itself to studying the role of women in volunteer work, she says the subject will certainly be investigated.
 "I hope to interview a good cross-section of people," she says. "I'll be visiting volunteer agencies in this area to see what volunteers are doing at the present time."
 "In August, I'll start interviewing people on the street to get their opinions on the subject."

Cleaning Ladies fall in extra inning

It's problems galore for the Family Cleaners ladies of the Halton County Ladies' Football League.
 After dropping a one run decision to Glen Williams earlier in the week the Acton entry fought tough through two extra innings before bowing to the Georgetown Georgettes 8-7.
 Sue Poulson carried the big bat for Acton pounding two home runs.
 A fifth inning belt brought three runs to the plate while a single in the seventh gave the locals a temporary lead in the top of the inning but the Georgettes fought to even the count in the bottom of the inning forcing extra innings before taking the win.
 Maureen Gerth supplied the power for the other Acton runs with a two run triple in the third.
 This has meant a considerable revision of existing programs for Brownies and Guides, and a completely new program for Pathfinders. The results of these revisions are now published in a book for adult leaders, called The Bridge.
 Four-member teams of program-specialists, trainers and commissioners (administrative personnel) from every province, the Territories, and the Armed Forces bases in West Germany, assembled at nearby Bolton in May, to be briefed on the changes. During the next few weeks all of the administrative personnel of the Girl Guides of Canada will attend similar sessions, conducted by these teams, so that everyone is prepared to cope with the details of organizing units for the girls in the fall.
 Highlights of the changes undoubtedly include the Pathfinder group for young teens. They have a different uniform, with navy slacks or skirts, white shirt, and a distinctive tie with green maple leaves. The emblems they may earn will be worn on a green sash from the waist. Their program is innovative, and individuals or groups of girls can choose to learn by doing, i.e. about edible wild plants, television, wilderness camping, how to go about fixing blocked drains, remodelling of clothes, how to make overseas phone calls, etc.

Current splashes

Registration for the last summer swimming lesson program will be held tomorrow (Thursday) between 7 and 9 p.m. Location for registration will be at the Gordon Alcott arena in Georgetown and at the Acton Arena in Acton. All registrations are on a first come first served basis.

There have been a number of back yard pools installed in Halton Hills over the years and with these pools it is important that pool users be aware of the safety practices that should be used. There have been a number of spinal (back) injuries occurring in back yard pools this summer due to unsafe practices, such as too long a dive and/or not keeping their hands over their heads when diving.

There are many other safe practices that you may not be aware of. Some of these may include the safe handling and storing of the pool chemicals, how to assist a person who may get into trouble because they can't swim, how to apply artificial respiration if necessary, etc. If you would like to learn about any of the above and more, you can by contacting the pools. The Recreation Department Aquatic staff will go out and give a demonstration on the above. If you would like to have a clinic held for your family and neighborhood, then arrange for a backyard pool and then call the Assistant Supervisor at the Georgetown Pools - 877-7721 or 877-1021, or Craig Gordon at the Acton Pool - 853-3140.
