

Cleaners capture crown Van's secure second spot

A three way battle for top spot in the Acton Industrial Fastball League ended Sunday night as Family Cleaners clinched first spot with a 9-2 win over last placed Station Hotel.

The Cleaners, despite holding first spot over most of the industrial season, had constant threats from Van's Welding and J and T Sports. The Welders prevailed over J and T in a crucial fight for second spot and a bye in the first round of play-offs. Van's topped Halton Hills Electric 7-1 while Unisal Construction burst J and T's by hopes by scoring a 6-4 win.

In Wednesday night action Van's came from behind to score a 16-8 win over the Hotelers.

In the Family affair a three run first inning turned out to be all the Cleaners would need as the pitching combination of Chuck Peavoy and Vince Thornton held the cellar dwellers at bay.

Earl Burt paced the Cleaners pouncing out a home run and a triple while Chuck Peavoy hit for a pair of singles and a double. Peavoy and Gary Wilson were the only Cleaners to touch home plate twice while Burt, Karl Killenbeck, Bill Armstrong, Robin Insoce and Cliff Britton all rounded the bases once.

Jamie Morris provided the runs for Station, belting a single in the first inning and scoring then reaching first on a fielder's choice in the eighth and adding to the total.

The upset of the Sunday industrial set came in the middle game when Unisal dampened J and T's hopes of a second place finish by scoring a 6-4 win.

J and T started off on the right foot scoring four unanswered runs in the first inning but that would be all as Alex Ward held them at bay for Unisal.

Dave Allen, Bruce MacArthur and Bruce Cunningham all reached base with first inning singles for the Sportsmen, scoring on a double by Larry King. King rounded the bases adding the Sportsmen's fourth run on a Steve Bennett single.

Unisal fought back for one run in the second inning as Al Bousfield scored a round tripper.

Peter Grimwood and Brian Canary added to the Unisal total in the fourth inning bringing the contractors to within one, but it wasn't until the eighth and final inning that Unisal took the lead.

A triple by Bousfield and then four straight singles, one each by Rick Istead, Dave Shannon, Armand Steeves and Peter Grimwood, gave Unisal a lead for the first time in the contest and a 6-4 upset win.

Van's Welding secured a bye in first round play-off action Sunday when they trounced Halton Hills Electric 7-1. Earlier in the week Van's had set aside Station 16-9.

The Welders counted a single run in the first inning off a Wally Ella

triple to take the lead in the contest and then added to their lead in the top of the third as another Ella triple and a Jim James' single contributed to the score.

Electric got their only run of the contest in the bottom of the third inning as a Bill Boyd triple turned into a home run on a Welder error.

Van's enhanced their lead in the fourth inning as Wally Ella crossed the plate for the third time and Dave Pielh, Jim James, and Daryl Whitten rounded the bases for their first time each.

A seventh Welders' run from Doug Wilson in the eighth inning produced a 7-1 final.

In their Wednesday night battle with last placed Station the Welders got off on the wrong foot as the Hotelers built up a 6-0 second inning lead.

The first four Station batters reached base and scored in the opening stanza as an upset looked as if it were in the making. Two more second inning tallies made it seem realistic but the Station bubble burst in the fourth as Van's counted three runs on three Electric errors.

Electric regained a four point margin in the bottom of the fourth as Jamie Morris scored his third run of the game but that was all for the Station.

Three sixth inning tallies pulled the Welders to within one run of Station and a six run outburst in the seventh and four more eighth inning runs gave the Van's side the victory.

In action this Sunday Van's Welding and J and T Sports meet in a 4:30 p.m. battle. At 6:30 p.m. Family Cleaners will do battle with Halton Hills Electric. In the final contest of the Industrial League regular season Unisal and Station tangle in an 8:30 p.m. battle.

A Family Cleaners' loss next week at the hands of Halton Hills Electric and a Van's Welding win would leave the two clubs tied but a better number of wins would give Family top spot. On the season Family took three of four contests from Van's.
