## Raiders increase admission fees

The increase in the use of ice times in the Halton Hills arenas has forced the Georgetown Raiders to up admission prices for the coming year.

"Although the town council has increased our rates by 33 per cent we feel it is not fair to the paying public to increase our prices by more than 10 per cent," said Raider president Bob Hooper.

"Of course by doing this we are risking heavy financial losses do to a smaller net gate receipt," he added.

The regular season prices this year will have adults paying \$2.50 while students will be asked for \$1.50. Childrens fees will be \$1. While the family rate is \$6.50.

The play-off rate increases .50 cents for adults and students and 25 cents for children. Anyone wishing to take the family to a Raider play-off game this season will be asked to pay \$8.

The Raiders will still, at least temporarily, admit senior citizens free of charge. "However, this may have to change," says president Hooper.

Booster club memberships will be \$3 per season.

## Midgets ousted with 8-1 setback

**Golf tips**

**Around the green**

**SHORT GAME**

The old adage "Drive for Show and Putt for Dough" are the most accurate words ever spoken about this game of golf. Any gorilla can learn how to "hammer" the ball; but, it takes knowledge and hours of practice (around the green) to be able to score well.

If the average player shoots 90, he will chip or putt, approximately 50 times during his round. It only makes sense then; that over half of your practice time should be devoted to the short game. Make sure you practise the following fundamentals.

**CHIPPING**

- 1) Hands must be ahead of the ball, in order to strike a descending blow. Don't try and "scoop" the ball up, allow the loft on the club to lift it.
- 2) Stance should be open. In other words the left foot pulled back further than the right foot. The feet should be closer together. This restricts the swing, giving you more control for the short shots.
- 3) Keep your head over the ball. Chipping requires very little body movement. Emphasize the hands and arms.
