Mr. and Mrs. George Lang and Bonnie Lang, and Ruth Russell of Guelph, spent the weekend at Parry Sound.

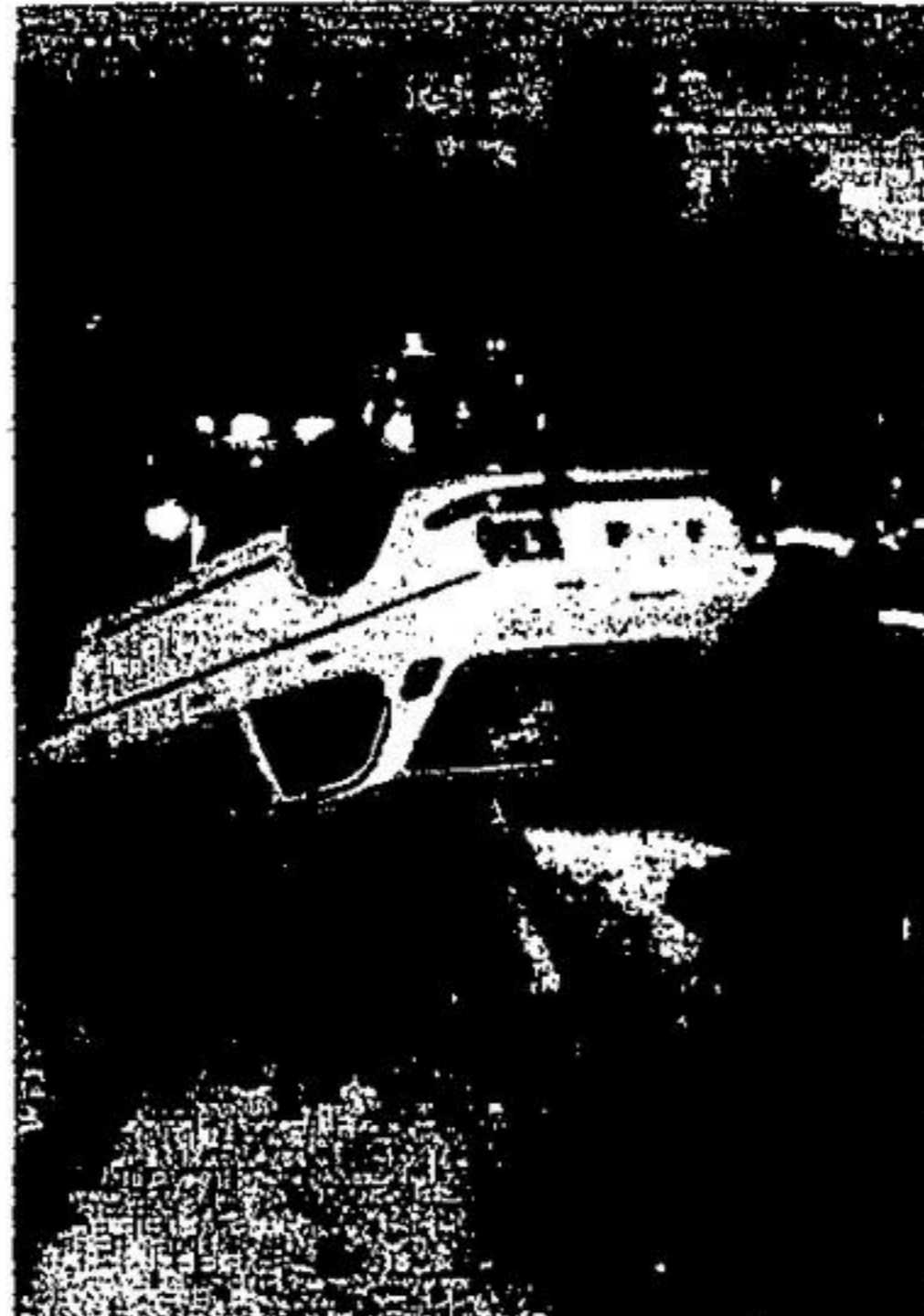

Endorse use on Milne land

Halton Hills planning board stuck to an earlier decision both by that board and council and endorsed the use of Annette Milne's land on Lot 31, Concession 10 for an outdoor recreation camp and residence.

In July, residents of the area asked council to withdraw their approval and notify the Niagara Escarpment accordingly. The planning report pointed out the Esqueving Official Plan provides for recreation uses in rural areas, and emphasized the town has no zoning control over lands with the NEC control area. The report concluded by pointing out the only control the town may have, would be through the noise bylaw, which is enforced by the police.

The 100 acre site, with 2,000 foot frontage on the Ninth Line and a depth of 2,000 feet, is planned for riding stable, cross country skiing, tennis, picnic areas as well as a residence and accessory buildings.

APPOINTMENT TO HALTON HILLS HYDRO-ELECTRIC COMMISSION

Bill 119 establishes the new Halton Hills Hydro-Electric Commission for the term expiring on the 30th day of November, 1980. The Halton Hills Hydro Commission shall consist of the Mayor of the Town of Halton Hills and the following additional members who shall be appointed by Council for the Town of Halton Hills:

- (i) Two members of the Hydro Electric Commission of the Town of Georgetown as it existed immediately before the coming into force of this Act.
- (ii) One member of the Hydro-Electric Commission of the Town of Acton as it existed immediately before the coming into force of this Act.
- (iii) One person who resides outside the part of the Town of Halton Hills supplied with power by the municipal commissions mentioned in paragraphs (i) and (ii) immediately before coming into force of this Act.

Applications for the position defined in Section (iii) above may be submitted to the undersigned until 4:00 p.m. Friday, August 24th, 1979 from eligible persons who desire to have their names considered for appointment by Council.

A person(s) interested in this appointment must be a qualified elector under The Municipal Elections Act, 1977 and resides outside the part of the Town of Halton Hills supplied with power by the municipal commissions mentioned in the above Sections (ii) and (iii).
