Entries: All entries for all Cattle Classes must be post marked not later than September 1st, 1979. The Board of Directors reserves the right to accept entries later than advertised date of closing if deemed advisable.

RULES:

(1) Exhibitors of purebred stock must produce registered certificates of pedigree. Pedigrees will be checked by someone appointed by the Society.

(2) All cattle being exhibited at the show will require a negative test for brucellosis conducted within 60 days of the opening of the fair, EXCEPT:

(a) Official brucellosis vaccinates under 18 months of age.

(b) Calves under six months of age.

(c) Steers

(d) Animals originating from Brucellosis Free Listed herds; and

(e) Animals originating from regions declared Free by Agriculture Canada.

(3) NUMBERS OF ENTRIES PER BREEDING UNIT (DAIRY)

Only one entry per class is eligible from a breeding unit, except the Fair may authorize in up to two classes, a maximum of two (2) entries in sections 1-2-3-4-5, and a maximum of three (3) entries permitted in sections 6-7-8-9-10.

Maximum total eligible entries from a breeding unit is ten (10) heads.
