

(4) Protests—All protests must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$10.00 which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Cattle Superintendent within 6 hours, after the occasion for such protest.

(5) The above rules will be strictly enforced.

1. All breeding class entries must be weighed at the show prior to showing with the birth date, show weight; and weight per day of age for animals up to 18 months of age (545) days old, being posted on cards provided.

2. Health certificates must be available for inspection. The health certificate number must also be listed on the entry form.

3. In class 14, if there are more than 3 exhibitors of any one breed, then that breed will obtain breed status. If there are less than 3 exhibitors in any one breed or group of breeds, the Directors of the Acton Fall Fair reserve the right to offer only 50% of the prize money listed above.

4. Entries must be received no later than Saturday, September 1st, 1979. Entries may be submitted to the Secretary of the Fair by mail or to one of the Cattle Chairmen by mail or by phone.

(5) Exhibitors are limited to one entry per section. However, the Acton Fall Fair Board has authorized two entries per section to a maximum of two sections. The exhibitors have the choice of section in which to make the second entry.
