DAIRY SECTION

SECTIONS

1. Bull calf born July 1st, 1978 to June 30th, 1979. From dam with at least one completed record with a minimum B.C.A. of 125 for milk. (Holstein 130).

2. Bull junior or senior yearling born July 1st, 1977 to June 30th, 1978. From dam with at least one completed record with a minimum B.C.A. of 125 for milk. (Holstein 130).

Grand Champion Bull.

Reserve Grand Champion Bull.

3. Female junior and senior calf born July 1st, 1978 to June 30th, 1979, from dam with at least one completed record with a minimum of BCA—120% of milk.

4. Female junior yearling born January 1st, 1978 to June 30th, 1978 from dam with at least one completed record with a minimum BCA of 120% for milk.

5. Female senior yearling born July 1st, 1977 to December 31st, 1977 from dam with at least one completed record with a minimum BCA of 120% for milk.

Junior Champion.

6. Female 2 year old born July 1st, 1978 to June 30th, 1977 in milk or dry. If dry, must be within approximately 8 weeks of calving. Must be either from a dam with at least one completed record, with a minimum BCA of 120% for milk, or the entry must have attained a production record equivalent to a minimum BCA of 120% for milk. If entry itself has a production record it must qualify on its own record.

7. Female 3 year old born July 1st, 1976 to June 30th, 1976, in milk or dry. If dry, must be within approximately 8 weeks of calving, must be either from a dam with at least one completed record with a minimum BCA of 120% for milk, or the entry must have attained a production record equivalent to a minimum BCA of 120% for milk. If the entry itself has a production record it must qualify on its own record.

8. Female 4 years old born July 1st, 1974 to June 30th, 1976, in milk or dry. If dry must be within approximately 8 weeks of calving. At least one record with a minimum of 120% BCA for milk.

9. Female 5 year old and up born prior to July 1974, in milk or dry. If dry must be within 8 weeks of calving. At least one record with a minimum of 120% of BCA for milk.

10. Dry cow, at least one record with a minimum BCA of 125 for milk. Must have completed her lactation within 120 days of the opening date of Acton Fair. Ribbon Class.

11. Breeder's Herd—Group of 4 animals bred and owned by exhibitor—not more than one bull. Each animal must have been exhibited in one of the classes for single animals.

12. Female with best udder: Limited to one entry per exhibitor. Must be shown in one other section. Entry must have at least two records with an average BCA of 140 for milk or BCA of 130 for 3 records. Records must be available at ringside.

13. Progeny of dam: 2 animals either sex. Ribbon.

14. Get of sire: One male, previously shown in regular class. Ribbon.

RULES & REGULATIONS

The registration certificate for each respective animal must show the exhibitor as "breeder" and as "owner" — in both cases either as an individual or partnership.

In other words, the exhibitor may be a "joint owner" of an animal and/or the "joint breeder" of an animal.

Exhibitors are limited to one entry per section, however the Acton Fair Board have authorized two entries per section to a maximum of two sections, and the exhibitor has his choice of the sections in which to make his second entries.

NUMBER OF CLASSIFICATIONS FOR SHEEP

The following breeds must be shown in short fleece (staple less than 1 inch or 2.54 cm): Border Cheviot, Dorset, Hampshire, Oxford Down, Shropshire, Southdown, Suffolk.

Other breeds may be shown in short or full fleece at the discretion of the fair.
