OBJECTIVES

1. To create greater interest among young people in caring for, feeding, developing and marketing of cattle and in the production and marketing of milk and milk products.
2. To develop a better general knowledge of breed type, and the judging and selection of cattle.
3. To encourage the improvement of the type and quality of cattle in the district.
4. To encourage the adoption of better feeding and management methods in the club district.

PROJECTS

1. To feed and care for one calf for the duration of the club year
2. To study recommended practices of feeding and management and keep records of the cost of production

BASIS OF AWARDS

- (a) 200 points each for exhibit of calf at Achievement Day, and showmanship.
- (b) 100 points each for attendance at meetings, Judging, Feed Reports, Care and Feeding Methods.
- (c) 150 points for Examination
- (d) 50 points for special project.

NOTE: Calves should be on the grounds at 9.30 a.m. Saturday, September 15th. Classes will be called at the discretion of the supervising committee.

4-H SPECIALS

1. (a) Kiwanis Club of the Kingsway Specials - Prizes will be awarded to the outstanding member in each 4 H Agricultural Club. Awards are presented at a special luncheon in Toronto (previous winners batted).
(b) J. Earle Whitelock Trophy - presented by the Kiwanis Club of the Kingsway to the outstanding 4 H Club Member in Halton. Awarded on the basis of overall participation in 4 H Clubs.
(c) Claude Bam Trophy - presented by the Kiwanis Club of the Kingsway to the outstanding first year member in 4 H work in Halton.
(d) Halton Peet Pork Producers' Association Trophy - presented by the Halton Peet Pork Producers' Association to the outstanding 4-H Club member in Halton with fewer than 12 projects completed.
2. (a) Nino Braida Trophy - presented to the top member in the 4 H Calf Club.
(b) Carol Murphy Trophy - presented to the Acton 4 H Calf Club member displaying the most enthusiasms toward club work.
(c) Halton Holstein Breeders' Club - donates a halter to first year 4 H members completing a project with a Holstein calf and \$2.50 to all 4 H members completing a project with a Holstein calf.
