RULES AND INFORMATION

1. Decision of the judges shall be final and the judges may withhold any award if in their opinion the exhibit is not worthy.
2. No more, no less, than the number of stalks, blooms or plants specified may be entered in a class.
3. Any bud showing colour is classed as one bloom.
4. All exhibits must be in suitable containers to prevent tipping when handled by judges or committee. No stem wiring permitted.
5. All due care will be taken, but no responsibility will be assumed for loss or breakage.

POTTED PLANTS

All exhibits in this class must be potted at least two weeks in advance before the fair.

Prize Money in Classes 1 to 34 as follows:

1st \$1.50, 2nd \$1.00, 3rd \$.75

1. Begonia—collection of three, all different varieties no more than 4" pot.
2. Specimen Coleus no more than 6" pot
3. Geranium, four or more blooms
4. Ivy or Variegated leafed geranium
5. Single crown African Violet in bloom
6. African Violet collection, 3 different single crown plants in bloom
7. Fuchsia in bloom
8. Potted plant—other than foregoing, in bloom
9. Potted plant—non-blooming other than foregoing
10. Terrarium planted (not over 14 inch diameter)
11. Cacti garden planted (not larger than 6x9")

CUT FLOWERS

All flowers in this section should be displayed in suitable containers, bowls, baskets, vases, etc., and arranged for best decorative effect.

12. Asters, 7 blooms, one color and type
13. Asters, any colors and types, 6 to 12 blooms
14. Gladiolus, 6 spikes, mixed colors
15. Gladiolus, 3 spikes, one color
16. Dahlias, 3 decorative type 8" or over
17. Dahlias, 3 cactus type 6" or over
18. Dahlias, 6 pompoms
19. Dahlias, 6 blooms (not pompoms) less than 6"
20. Pansies, not more than 12 blooms
21. Snapdragons, mixed or one color
22. Petunias, Sugar Plum variety only
23. Petunias, double
24. Petunias, single (other than Sugar Plum)
25. Zinnias, large flowered (over 3")
26. Zinnias, small flowered (under 3")
27. Marigolds, small French type (not over 12 blooms)
28. Marigolds, large African type (not over 12 blooms)
29. Cosmos, any color or colors
30. Nasturtium, not more than 12 blooms
31. Geranium blooms, any color or colors
32. Rose, one single specimen
33. Roses, any color or colors
34. Bowl of Sweet Peas
