

- 3. Any bud showing colour is classed as one bloom.
- 4. All exhibits must be in suitable containers to prevent tipping when handled by Judges or committee. No stem wiring permitted.
- 5. All due care will be taken, but no responsibility will be assumed for loss or breakage.

POTTED PLANTS

All exhibits in this class must be potted at least two weeks in advance before the fair.

Prize Money in Classes 1 to 34 as follows:
