"Glamour Dressing" in classic separates in real evening fabrics, flashy trims, metallic yarns or the head turning, romance, fantasy, grand entrance dresses. Luxury and extravagance are the key words to evening elegance for Fall '79. And what about color, texture, fabric for the new structured head turning glamour looks? Ms. Schuett gives the direction toward rich fashion darks, especially in the suit category. In all categories of

ready-to-wear grey and burgundy emerge as a very important color story, burgundy becoming the single most important color. Brights and Blacks, black as the focal point, give the night life dressing the sparkling, sensational looks. The feel of fabrics, Ms. Schuett adds, is a functional and modern as the new styling. Tweeds, tartans, flannels and bouclés are important issues in sportswear and suits. Double knits return with jerseys, angoras, ribs and jacquard, velvets and iridescents for city and night dressing. The mood is a modern, streamlined approach; the practical entrance to the 1980's.
