

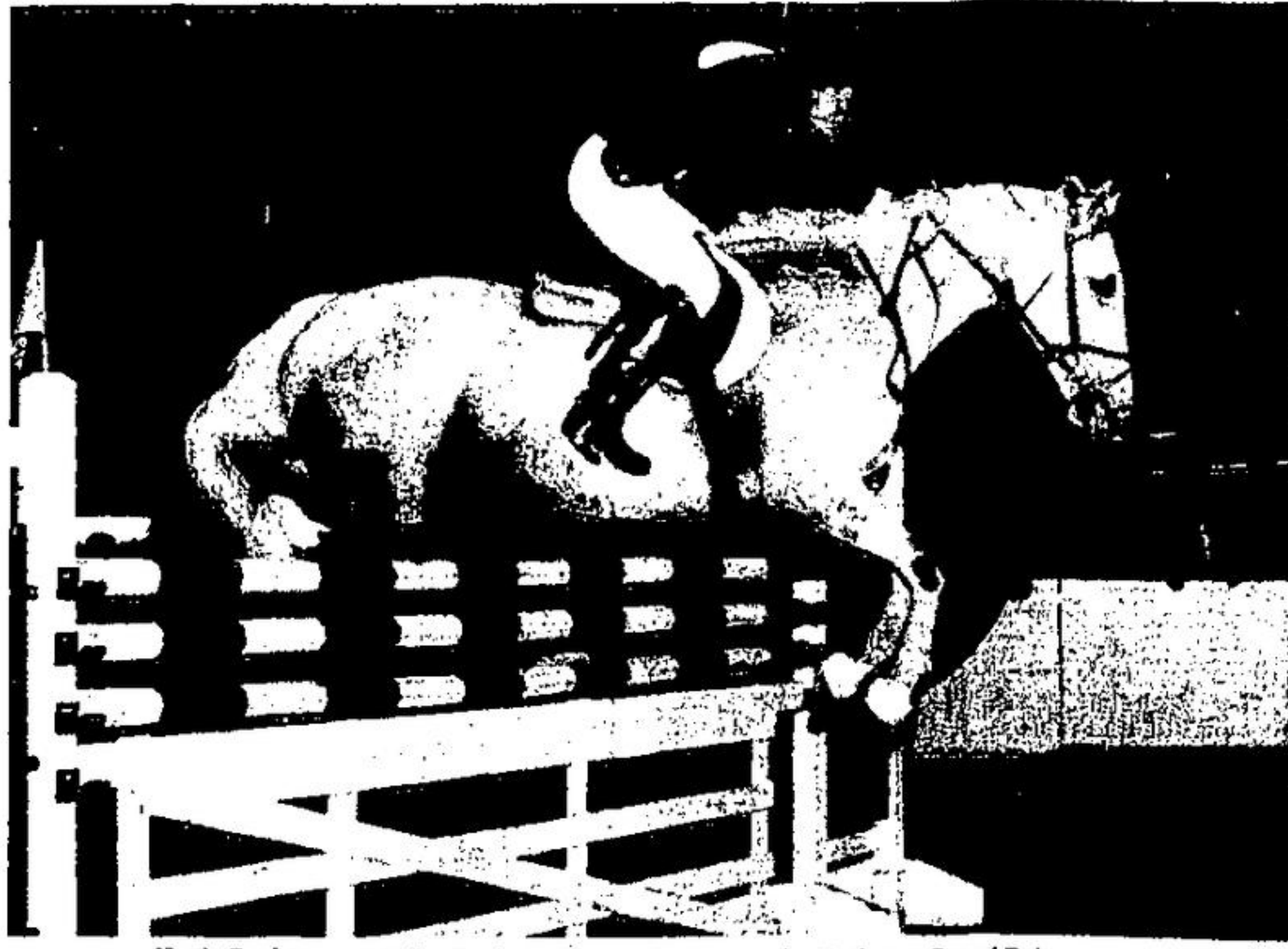
Graham third in Grand Prix

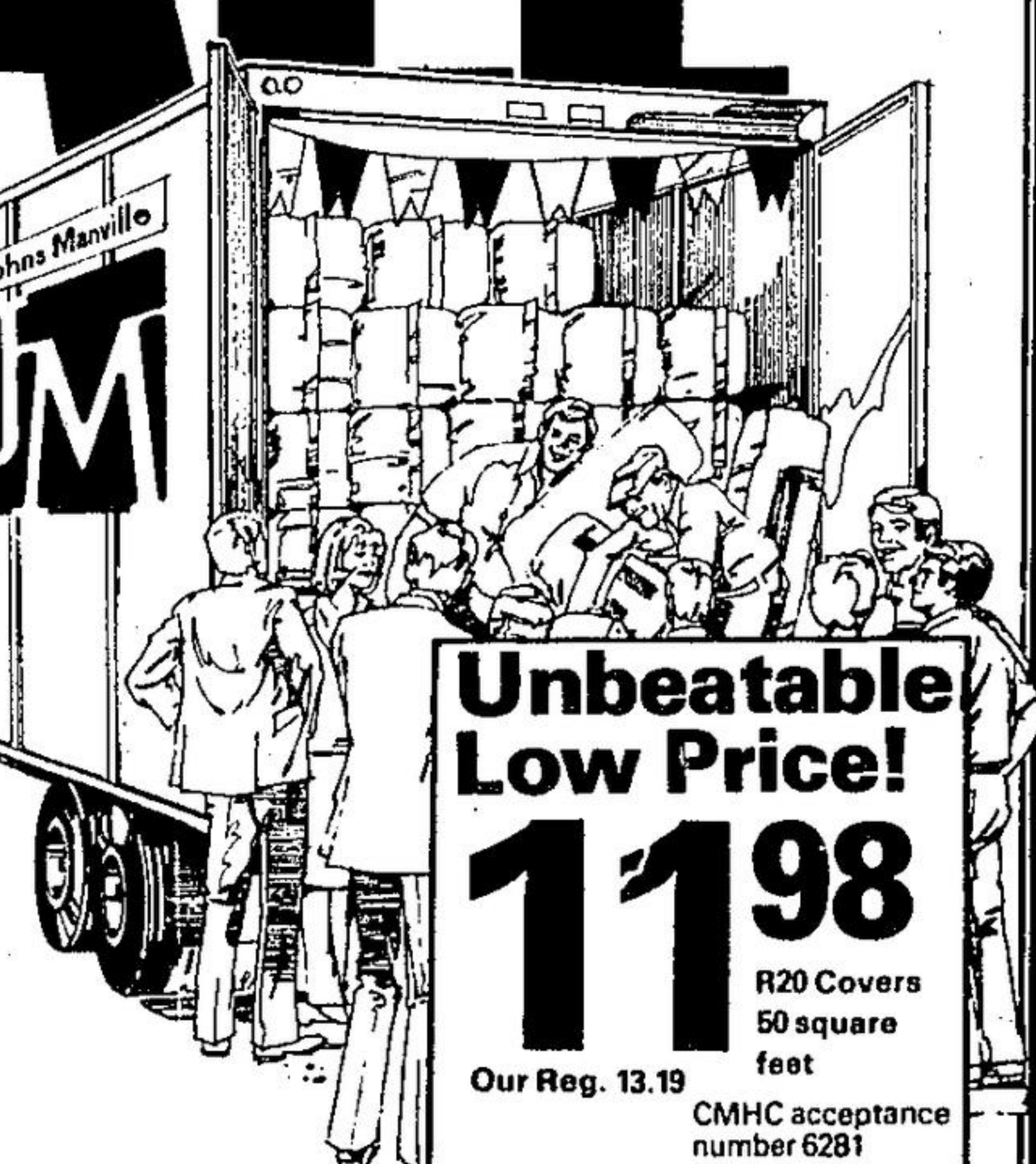
