Ontario encourages Halton to form sr. citizen options

Ontario wants Halton Region to come up with new programs for senior citizens so it can take advantage of the \$2 million in funds available. Margaret Buddo, senior citizens consultant with the Ministry of Community and Social Services, said it is "hoped that by directing some of our limited financial resources into new and expanded home

support programs, a greater number of seniors will be served." She said funding will be split between existing programs for seniors and new submissions from regional governments. The present programs which will continue to be funded are: Meals on Wheels, Wheels to Meals, Housekeeping Services, home maintenance, handyman services,

transportation for shopping and medical appointments, friendly visiting, telephone reassurance, security checks, personal care services, counselling, and referral.

The Province, she said, would pay 50 per cent and the remaining 50 per cent would come from the region and the volunteer section.

She told last Tuesday's meeting of the region health and social services committee, new programs are to be encouraged.

"In order to develop new services, we are seeking proposals from communities where there are few or no services now and those communities where the homes for the aged and nursing homes have long waiting lists," she said.

Seven criteria have been established by the ministry. They are:
1. Number of people needing services in the community including a definition of the criteria to assess the need for the service.
2. The availability of existing services and the impact of new service on the existing service.
3. Program specifics such as the type of activities and schedule.
4. Staffing required, paid or volunteer.
5. Budget forecast including the costs and possible source of revenue.
6. User charge including proposed guidelines

LDC corrects old severance

An old Esqueing severance for an R. R. 4 family was corrected by Halton's Land Division Committee (LDC) during last week's meeting in Halton Hills.

The LDC granted a conditional severance to John Van Arragon, on northeast half of Lot 21 Concession 3. The new severance corrects a conveyance made by the township committee of adjustment six years ago. That conveyance carried some conditions, which have been met, according to Van Arragon's lawyer Terry Baines.

One can't impose conditions that continue on after the consent is granted, Mr. Baines said to LDC members.
One of Van Arragon's sons, John Jr., has nearly completed construction on one of the lots created in 1973.

The committee granted the severance with a preamble that the son is aware of plans of Indusmin to open quarries near the house. A letter from Indusmin was read aloud at the meeting.
