as the White Church. In 1964 the church was closed and the fittings sold. The Credit Vally Conservation Authority bought it and the site in 1969. The pulpit and pews and other artifacts were returned. The church sat empty except for a wedding in 1971, until the Thanksgiving service was established by the CVCA in 1974. Each year since the church has been filled to overflowing for the Thanksgiving service.

This year the service will be held Sunday, October 7 at 2 p.m.

Following the church's 142 year tradition, the service will feature old tamiliar hymns and music supplied by John Lane of Alton and the Tweedsmuir Presbyterian Church choir from Orangeville.

An immunization clinic is being held at the Acton Community Services next Wednesday afternoon, the first of regular chnics held by the Halton Regional Health Unit.

It is recommended that adults be vaccinated against Polio every five years and tetanus every ten years. Children should follow a recommended schedule for protection against diseases like diptheria, whooping cough, tetanus, polio, measles, mumps, and German measles.

The clinic, which will be held every second month all year long, will also offer vaccinations required for people travelling outside of Can-
