Emergency number debate centres on police report

Any further Halton Region discussion on a 911 emergency telephone number system will wait for a detailed report now being prepared by Halton Deputy Police Chief Ken Skerrett.

The region's administration and finance committee had received a report last Wednesday stating the \$232,336 cost to implement the system across Halton, was too costly in a time of fiscal restraint.

Oakville Mayor Harry Barrett asked the committee to table the report so it could be tied in with the deputy chief's

The regional report dealt strictly with cost while the police report will cover cost in addition to the number of complaints the force has received about long-distance and/or confusing telephone exchanges.

Councillors said residents had tried dialing 911 and had contacted Hamilton Wentworth Police or had been connected by the Bell operator with the Brampton Fire Department or had trouble trying to find the emergency numbers in the telephone book.

Milton Mayor Don Ger-

don said emergency number problems in Milton had been solved when the Salvation Army distributed small, adhesive stickers designed to fit under the telephone receiver.

"That's the best way of solving the whole thing," said Councillor Steve Toth in support of Mayor Gordon.

Regional staff had asked Bell Canada for the cost of putting in a 911 system after several requests in the past.

Councillors agreed with staff \$232,336 was too much to pay.
