The Swim-A-Thon is to raise money for some new equipment.



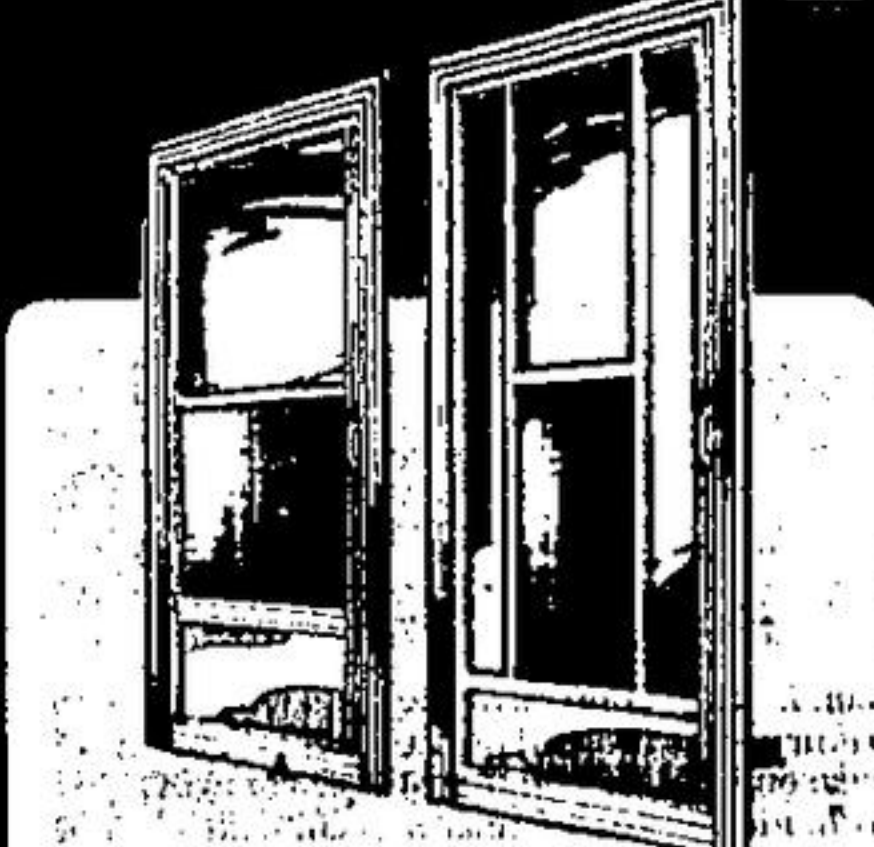

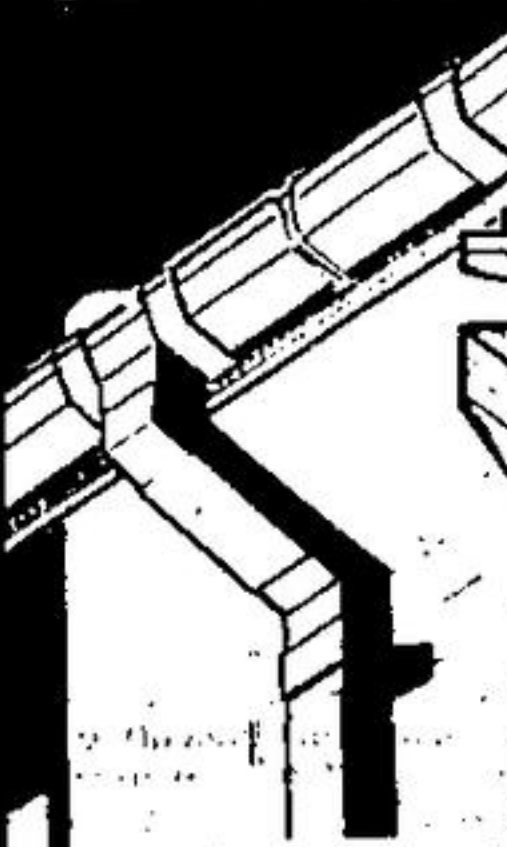

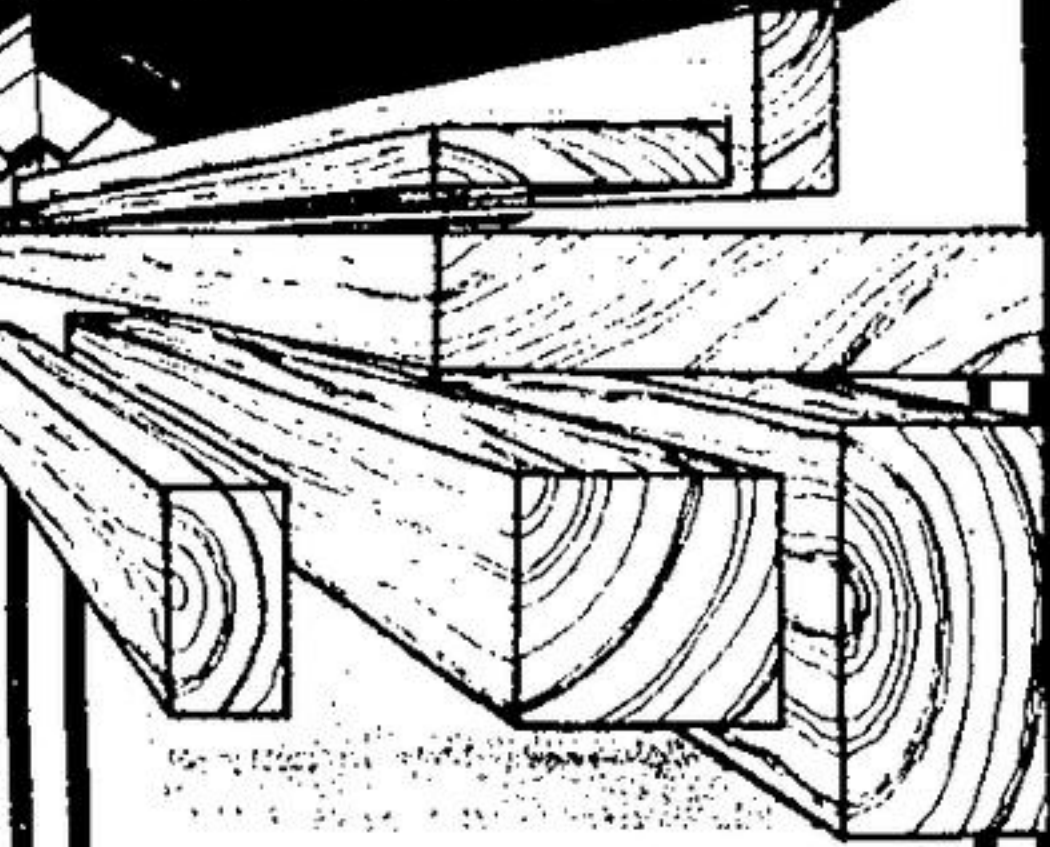
