In the junior exhibit, Jill Morris won the Acton Women's Institute special, with Tiju Jago second. Parris Jago was third. In the Dublin Women's Institute special, Elizabeth Bird was first, Tammy Hunter second and Sandi Hunter third. Virginia Hulme had the most points in the crafts and hobbies, in the home-crafts.

In the Western Horse show, Karen Rubnikowicz won the high point performance trophy. Brian Robertson won the Game trophy.

Stan Driscoll and sons won the Champion Breeders Flock Trophy in the sheep show. In the pigeons, Wayne Mason won the best roller in the show. Al Howard won the best flying homer, and John Tilt had the best pidgeon in the show.

In the chicken show, Fred Kentner won the best chicken in the show, as well as the best female. Bill Shannon had the best trio.

In the cattle show, Jeff Nurse had the supreme champion dairy female. Burthlene Farms had the supreme champion beef herd.

Staffer hired despite freeze

Regional council's edict on a staff hiring freeze is not as sacrosanct as Halton Hills councillor Roy Booth would like.

Council Wednesday approved a health and social services committee recommendation that a private home day care home visitor be hired on a part-time (three day a week) basis and "the staff complement be adjusted accordingly."

Mr. Booth said he was against the hiring simply because it meant adding more staffers at a time when the region was on record as opposing additions.

Chairman Jack Raftis said it is anticipated the revenues generated by

the home visitor, will offset his or her salary.

He said he considered it similar to the hiring one month ago of a person to monitor sludge disposal.

Mr. Raftis said the money saved on proper sludge surveillance pays for the person doing the monitoring.

The recommendation passed.
