50 years of service

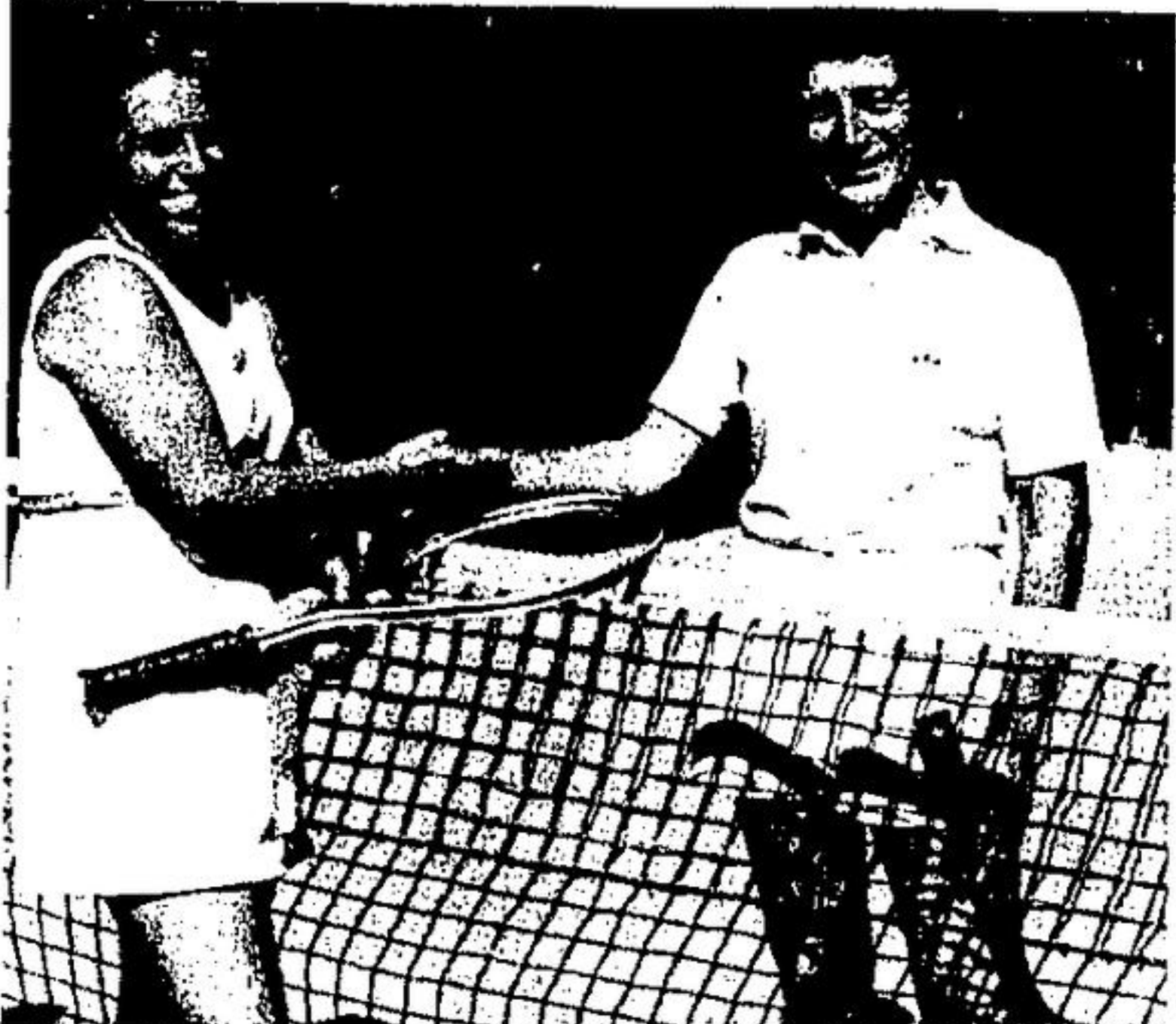

The honored worker is now 74 and noted "I am going to retire, but I don't think I'll quit for a while yet." The energetic senior was busy digging out his basement—by hand—before getting ready for the evening's festivities. Member of Parliament Albert Fish, on hand for the occasion, brought his own congratulations and a letter of tribute from

Prime Minister Joe Clark. Member of Provincial Parliament Jack Johnson praised Mr. Meadows "an outstanding civil servant" and delivered a tributary plaque on behalf of Premier Davis. Deputy Reeve David Masson brought greetings from Eramosa Township Council. Hugh McConville, Director South Western Postal District, presented a plaque to the honored courier. Rockwood Post Office staff and rural couriers presented a gift and a dozen long stemmed red roses. Fellow courier Ivy Ritchie pointed out that Ozzie is noted not only for his prompt service, but also his willingness to lend a helping hand.

Retired Rockwood Post Master George Day and Postmistress Marg Cox recalled Mr. Meadows' always efficient service. Representing neighbours and friends, Gord Thomson unveiled a gift for the couple—a colored television—"a thank you for the years of perfect service."


