Mustangs capture title

Milton High School Mustangs captured last year's tournament final loss and outslugged Bishop MacDonell of Guelph 22-5 to capture the Acton High School Fourth Annual Invitational Baseball Tournament Friday.

The Mustangs rolled over opposition in a round robin event going undefeated and then pouncing Bishop Mac in the final. The Mustangs scored an 8-2 win over the host Acton team in the opening round, felled Bishop MacDonell 10-4 in their second game and then topped Assumption of Burlington 9-5 to advance to the final.

The Acton team was the only team to go winless in the event falling to Assumption 9-0 and

Bishop Mac 7-2 along with their Milton defeat. In a closely contested match Bishop MacDonell and Assumption played to a 3-3 tie. Despite identical records Bishop Mac advanced to the finals against the Mustangs edging Assumption 16-15 on total base runners.

The tournament is run slightly different than most ball tournaments. Each team must be made up of five boys and four girls, a girl must pitch at least three innings in the round robin and four in the tournament final. Jackie Dennis handled the ladies' pitching for the Mustangs with Mike

Van Den Boon and Ted Postma handling the rest of the throwing duties.

Over the round robin portion of the tournament Milton counted 27 runs on 24 hits and left 19 runners on base. Second placed Bishop Mac scored 14 times on 16 hits and left 16 runners stranded.

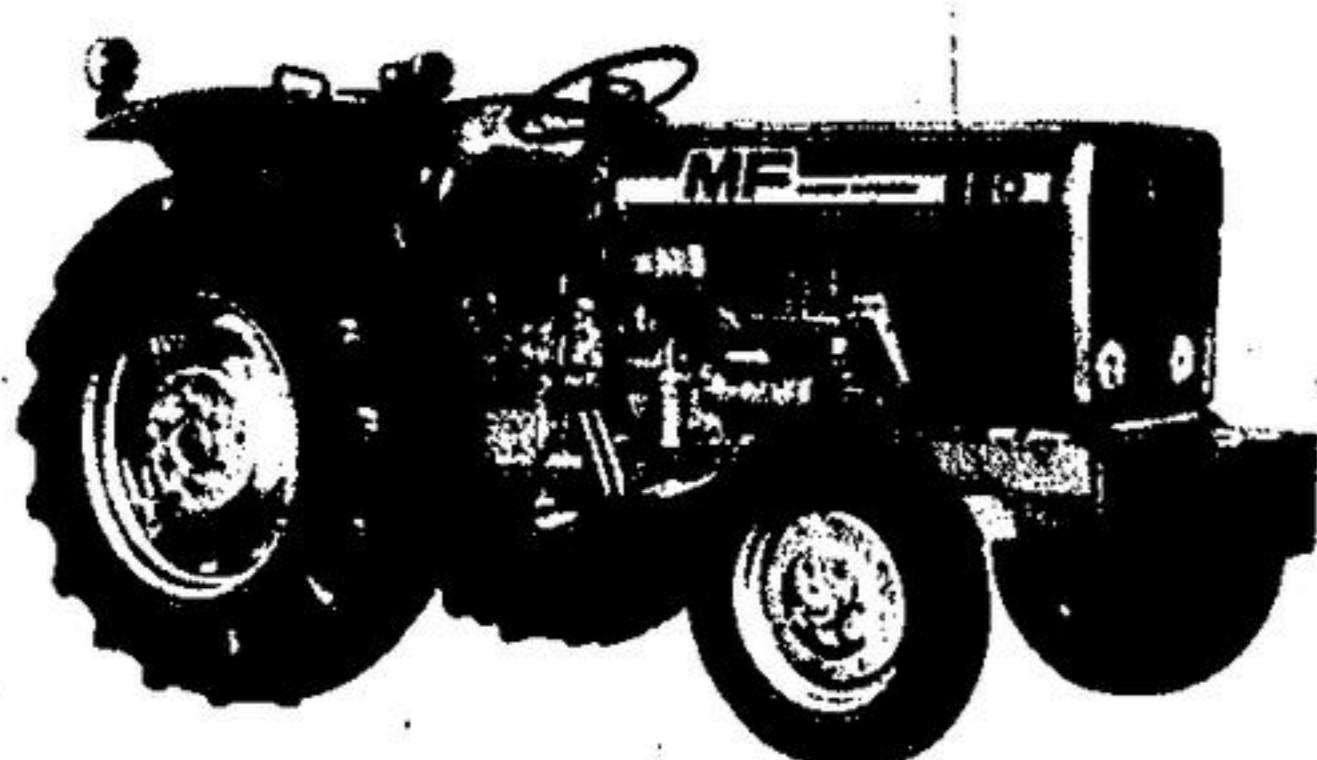
Daley said he wasn't impressed with the play of many of his performers in the two wins, adding it isn't much of a feat to beat those two clubs.

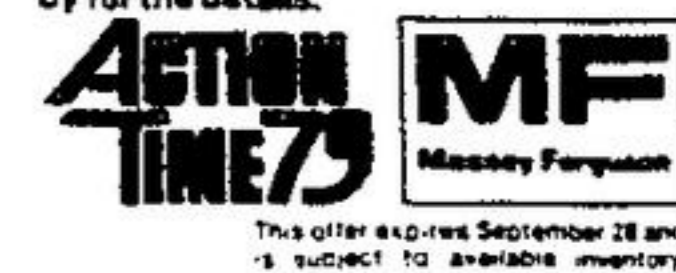

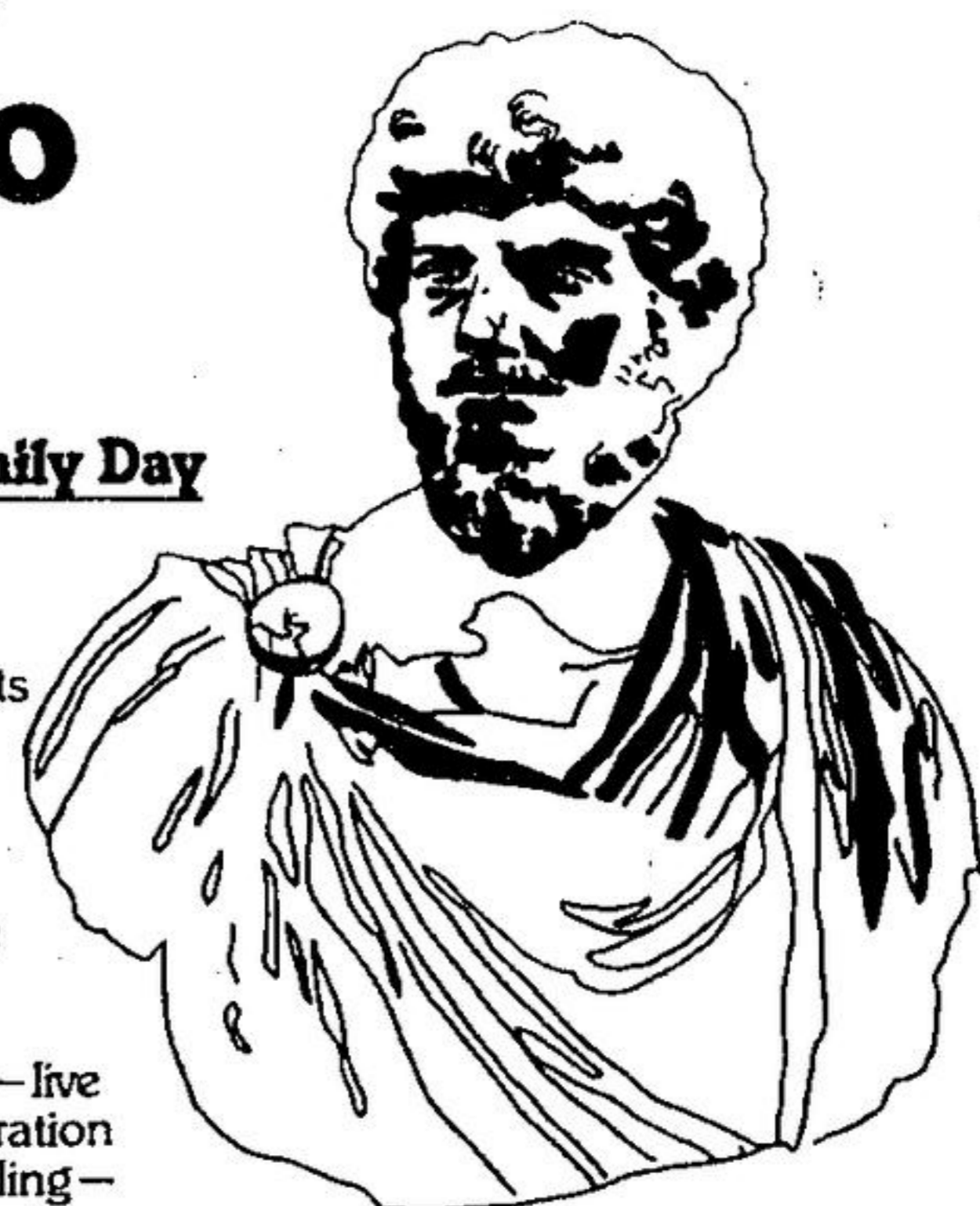
