

# Kavanagh and White

Acton High School's tennis team travelled to Oakville last week to compete in the Halton County Championships. Acton fared well in advancing players into semi-finals play but were successful in advancing only one pair to the Peel-Halton Championship today (Wednesday) in Mississauga.

Ken Kavanagh and Kelly White were the only pair from Acton High to advance topping Aldershot 6-4, 6-4 to capture the Halton Junior Mixed Doubles crown. In earlier rounds the Acton combination of White and Kavanagh disposed of Burlington Central 9-4, Oakville Trafalgar 9-7 and then sidelined Aldershot in straight sets.

Shirley Ancker advanced to the senior girls' singles before being sidelined by a White Oaks competitor. To advance to the Peel-Halton meet a competitor must advance to the Halton finals. Miss Ancker defeated Lester B. Pearson 9-4 and MM Robinson 9-0 to reach the semis.

Bob McClure and Colleen Crimless who supplied another hope for Acton, were eliminated in semi-final play, dropping a 9-6 match to Nelson in Senior Mixed

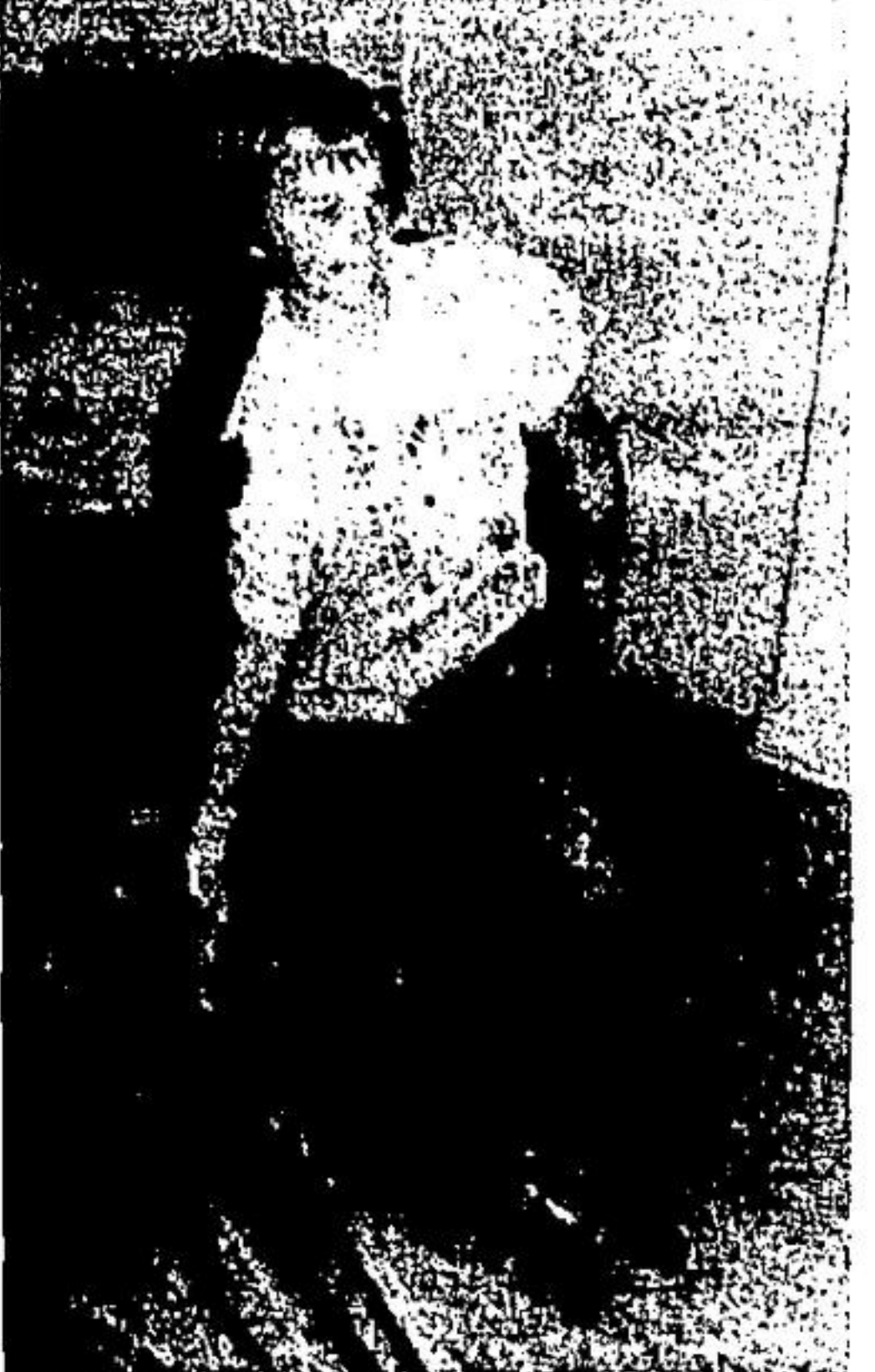
Standings to date are Strikers 7, Platers 6, Beamers 4, Finishers 3, Polishers 3, Rollers 1.
