

Jr. basketballers take senior trophy

Acton High School's success at the Collingwood Invitational Basketball Tournaments was never more evident than on the weekend when our Junior Girls travelled north to compete in the Collingwood Fourth Annual Senior Tournament.

Acton has a habit of coming home from Collingwood with a trophy whether it be consolation or championship. The Junior Girls dropped a 38-36 overtime squeaker to the host

Collingwood in their first journey game and then went the distance in the consolation round outdoing the older girls to bring home the silverware.

After their first round defeat Acton handed Walkerton a 37-29 loss before topping Stayner 26-25 in the consolation championship.

Against Collingwood, a team that advanced to the Championship final, Linda Osso carried much of the offensive thrust netting 18 points with

Barb Wilson scoring five.

Acton coaches Lyn McLaren and Anne Lepik were pleased with the way Acton Juniors handled themselves in the event, especially the match with Collingwood. "Collingwood were the OFSAA reps for this area last year," said McLaren, "and they were the biggest team (size and numbers) in the tourney," added Lepik.

In their second match Acton scored a big first period lead but fell on

hard times in the second quarter as Walkerton evened the count. Acton trailed by three points at three quarter time but powered their way to victory in the final period. Mardie Phillips paced the Acton attack with 12 points followed closely by Linda Osso with 11.

In the consolation final the Acton team was hard pressed and needed six straight hoops to overcome a 16-9 half time deficit and score the win. Phillips led the Acton scoring for the second straight game netting nine points while Linda Osso added seven.

The Acton coaches were pleased with the outcome feeling that the defensive play of their young team was the highlight. "They handled the pressure well for a junior team," commented Lepik. "We made more mistakes and were still able to win." Coach McLaren pointed out that the mistakes the girls made were because of inexperience and were "coachable mistakes."

The pressure of staying close to the other tournament teams may have been intensified on the Acton girls as the other teams participating in the event were unaware that Acton was a junior squad.

In exhibition games over the past week the Acton Juniors scored a pair of wins topping Bishop MacDonell of Guelph 32-35 and Centennial, also of Guelph, 49-16.

Linda Osso led the Acton scoring in both games netting 11 in the Mac win and 16 against Centennial.

The girls have one last exhibition game, tonight (Wednesday), against Chingacousy before preparing for their league opener next Thursday against Queen Elizabeth Park.
