

## Separation granted on Sixth Line

George Moore will be allowed a three acre separation from his 25 acre lot on the Sixth Line, north of Highway 7, and will be able to continue his beekeeping.

Halton Hills planning department was opposed to the separation granted by the Land Division Committee, and wanted council to appeal the decision. This week they refused to appeal, since they too felt the separation was justified.

The planning department contended the remaining 22 acre parcel would be below the minimum size of 25 acres legal for any farming property, and suggested it would constitute strip development.

Moore plans to sell the existing house and three acres, and build a smaller house on the remainder, and keep his colonies of bees in the open area.

In his presentation to Land Division Com-

mittee, Moore pointed out there had never been a separation from the land, and emphasized the need for beekeeping among agricultural crops. Four neighbors attending Land Division Committee meeting said they had no objections to the separation.

Councillor Russ Miller argued the separation should stand since without it Moore would have to sell his whole property. He said the bees are a necessity to pollinate crops, and are an asset to the community.

Planner Mario Venditti contended if the town does not support the

appeal the breach of the bylaw is being condoned.

Councillor Ross Knechtel commented, "There will always be things that don't fall strictly within the rules and regulations which will rot the socks of planners." He said it is common sense to allow the severance.

Only Councillors Harry Levy, John McDonald and Walter Biehn opposed.

### Children's Aid gets shot in arm

Ministry of Community and Social Services officials have assured the Halton Children's Aid Society they will advance the necessary funds to allow it to continue operation while budget problems are being ironed out.

Halton CAS officials are concerned that unless budget difficulties are resolved, the agency would be forced to close its doors in November. The society is \$100,000 in the red and has been seeking an extended line of credit to carry it.

Following a meeting with the ministry last week, Halton CAS

treasurer William DeVries said the province has agreed to "advance us these funds instead, but without prejudice as to the final outcome of a budget discussion."

The groups are slated to meet again Friday in an attempt to come to an agreement on the society's 1979 budget.

Halton along with 10 other societies in Ontario joined forces in seeking ministry review of proposed budget cutbacks.

According to DeVries, the financial problem has arisen because the approved budget from the Region of Halton (which provides 20 per cent of the

society's funds) is substantially greater than the budget approved by the province.

"We have run into a cash-flow problem in that our expenses are greater than our income and we had a bank credit for this purpose of \$100,000."

"This credit has been used in the past month from time to time as required," DeVries said.
