Fields fires three for pressmen Lakeview rallies to top ATW

Henry Toebes with 20 seconds remaining in the frame.

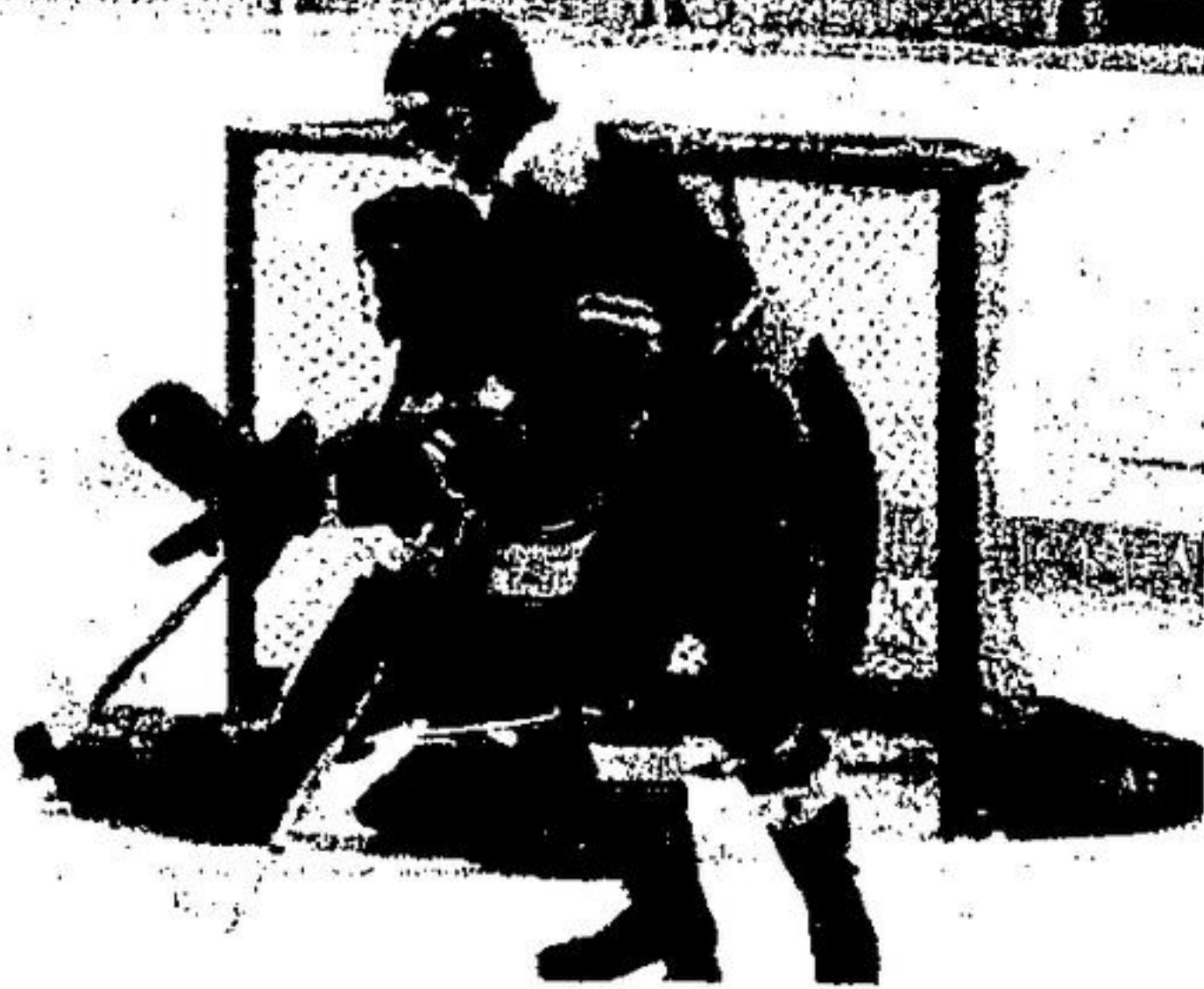
Helters' pulled to within two at the 16 minute mark of the second stanza as Lorne Gordon found the range with help from Dave Thompson and Bill Severinski.
