Rebels demonstrate running power Thatcher leads Acton contingent

Georgetown High School Cross Country team was next to unbeatable at the Halton High School Cross Country Championships at Kelso last Wednesday.

The Rebels won the meet going away losing the first spot in only two races, the junior and senior girls' events. In those races Georgetown runners finished second and third.

There wasn't one division the Rebels weren't able to capture in the event as they took the overall championship by almost 300 points. In cross-country the team with the lowest points is the winner. The first place finisher picks up one point on his team total, the second finisher — two. The top four finishers on each team are tabulated together to give the team result.

Georgetown picked up 95 points over the six divisions with their midget girls and junior boys picking up the lowest total, 11 each. Milton finished the team competition in second spot with 387 while Acton

placed third with 578. In the boys' overall championships Georgetown picked up 52 points, Milton 160, White Oaks 205, and Acton 295.

The Georgetown girls accumulated 43 points with Milton tallying 227 and Acton 281. They were the only schools to enter

complete teams in all events.

The top Acton runner on the day was Heather Thatcher in the junior girls' division. Miss Thatcher placed sixth only 40 seconds behind the winner Paula Schnurr from Assump-

tion in Burlington.

Swim team prepares for competitive season

The Halton Hills Swim Team is in a competitive, speed swimming league with Chinguacousy, Etobicoke, Caledon, TOMAC, Burlington and Oakville. These seven teams will compete at monthly meets in a round robin series, ending the season with an all day meet for all seven teams in June.

The Halton Hills Swim Team will host the first meet of the season on November 18, 1979. There is still room for more swimmers on the team!!!

All swimmers are divided into age groups for competition. These age groups are: 6 years & under, 7 and 8 years, 9 and 10 years, 11 and 12 years, 13 and 14 years, 15 years and over, age groups.

The distances of the different races vary according to the age of the competitor. For example, the 6 years and under and 7 and 8 years age group only swim 25 metre races (one length

of the pool). As the swimmers become older, the number of lengths in a race will increase accordingly. However, right from the beginning all swimmers learn to do each of the competitive strokes regardless of their age grouping. The different competitive strokes are Free Style, Back Stroke, Breast Stroke and Butterfly.

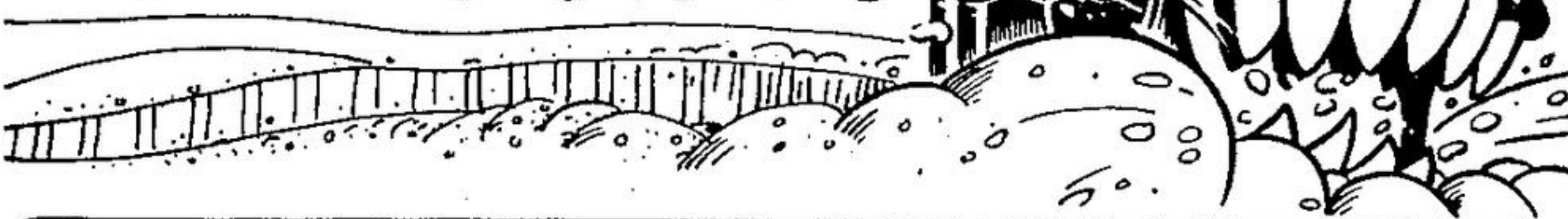

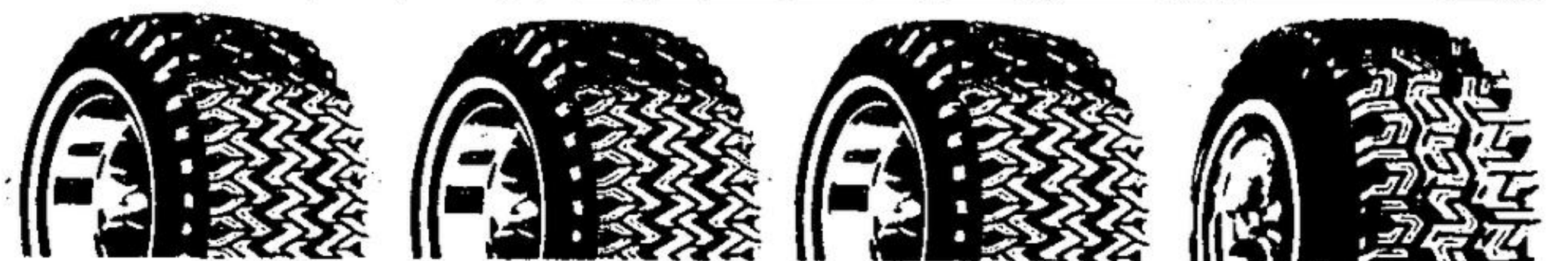
