Five are baptized

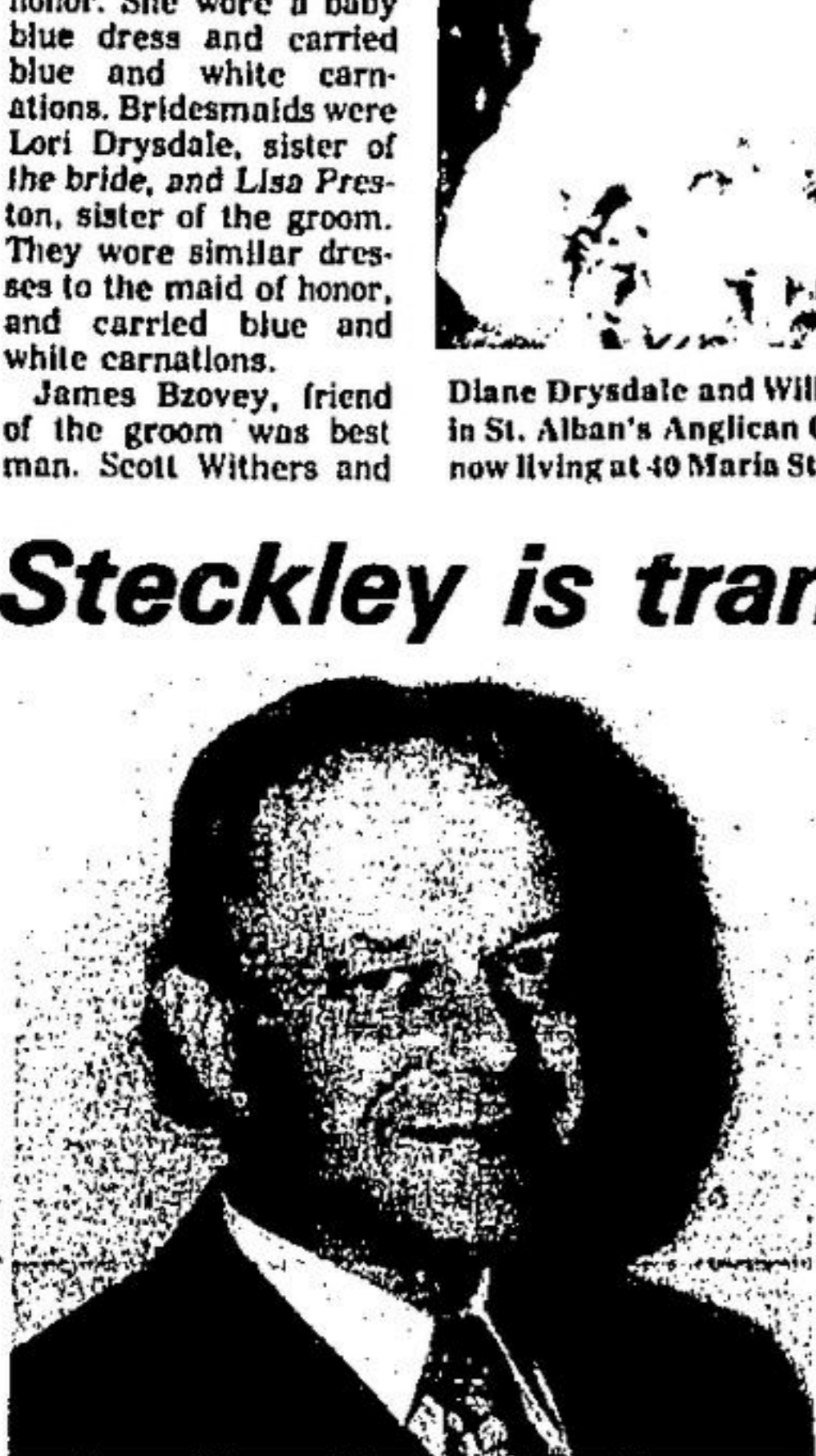
