Report from Queen's Park

Energy Supplies
The Ministry of Energy has announced that many homeowners wishing to convert from heating oil to natural gas may have to wait until next spring or summer, due to an overwhelming demand for conversions. By the end of September this year, the three major natural gas utilities had converted 19,650 homes to natural gas, compared to 8,600 last year. The change from heating oil to natural gas is being accelerated by the government's investment in natural gas pipeline projects to increase the supply of natural gas.

Hydro Forecasts
The Legislative Committee on Hydro Affairs is recommending that no more construction contracts be awarded for the Darlington nuclear site until Hydro presents the Legislature with a new construction program based on drastically lowered projections for electricity demand. The Committee's draft report says the Government should plan for a Hydro load growth of 2 to 3 per cent annually rather than the average of 5 per cent to 1985 and 4 per cent thereafter forecast by Ontario Hydro last spring.

Ontario's Health Care System
The Minister of Health has stated that he'll use public money to respond to people identifiable on the 274,852-name petitions presented by the NDP which denounce the Province's health-care system. He was unable to estimate how much it would cost to send letters to these people, but stated it wouldn't come from government funds for the operation of hospitals or the Ontario Health Insurance Plan, but from his Ministry's administrative budget. The Minister suggested that the vague wording on the petitions might have persuaded many people to sign, even though they might not believe the health-care system was being threatened. "They were worried in such a way that nobody could refuse to sign. There's some I could have signed," he said. "I am going to tell them the fact that since 1972 the per capita spending on health-care has gone up from \$205 to \$500 and even when one allows for inflation that's a big increase. I think it is in the interests of public information and the democratic system that the people have the information."

Lack of Skilled Workers
About 50 per cent of the manufacturers who answered a survey by the Ontario Labour Ministry are having trouble filling jobs in skilled trades. The positions which employers are trying to fill are for machine operators, machinists, tool die and mold makers, engineers, welders and electricians. Employers said many applicants lacked skills.

Jelinek predicts Royal inquiry

The Federal Cabinet is currently considering a full-blown Royal Commission to replace the Canadian Transport Commission (CTC) inquiry into the Mississauga train derailment. The Champion has learned the announcement of the Royal Commission inquiry will probably come by the end of this week so the government will be able to select commission members in time for the Dec. 4 start of the CTC inquiry already planned. Halton MP Otto Jelinek, a member of the transport commission who was at the scene of the disaster for three days, told The Champion, "I have already brought this up to our caucus and this has gone to cabinet where it is being discussed actively. I would expect that the announcement will come this week... as Cabinet is giving this serious consideration." Mr. Jelinek said the reason for a Royal Commission "is because we need an inquiry of wider scope as it affects all of Canada." Such an inquiry, he said, would be in keeping with the new Dangerous Goods Act which was debated last night in the House of Commons, and which unveiled "stringent new regulations that will make sure we never have another situation like that in Mississauga two weeks ago."

House of Commons standard rules of motion were waived last night when the proposed new legislation on handling dangerous substances was limited to one speaker from each party so that it could move to Parliament transport committee today for review. Mr. Jelinek said he expects the new bill will be discussed speedily and could be back before the Commons while the Royal Commission is still in session.
