Lower limits

Regional council will today approve changes to Halton Hills by-laws changing speed limits on some roads from 50 kmh to 40 kmh; on some roads from 80 kmh to 70 kmh; and prohibiting heavy traffic on some roads.

As the roadways are town-owned, and do not affect the regional road system, approval is a formality.

Pitch-In Day held June 7

Halton residents will be asked to take part in Pitch-In Day, a one-day environmental blitz to beautify Ontario's back country and byways.

Pitch-In Day is the project of the Ontario Ministry of the Environment and will be held June 7, 1980, organized with the help of the 20,000-member Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters (OFAH).

Volunteer pitch-in squads from service clubs, schools and other citizen groups will undertake local environmental projects including clean-up blitzes to clear litter, refuse and junk from streams, rivers, lakeshores, rural back roads and byways, trails, picnic areas, campsites and other off-the-beaten-path recreation areas which lack regular collection services.

The Ministry will launch a major advertising campaign to push the idea.

OFAH will divide Ontario into six zones for the project.
