The bylaw calls for the house to be built first and other buildings later.

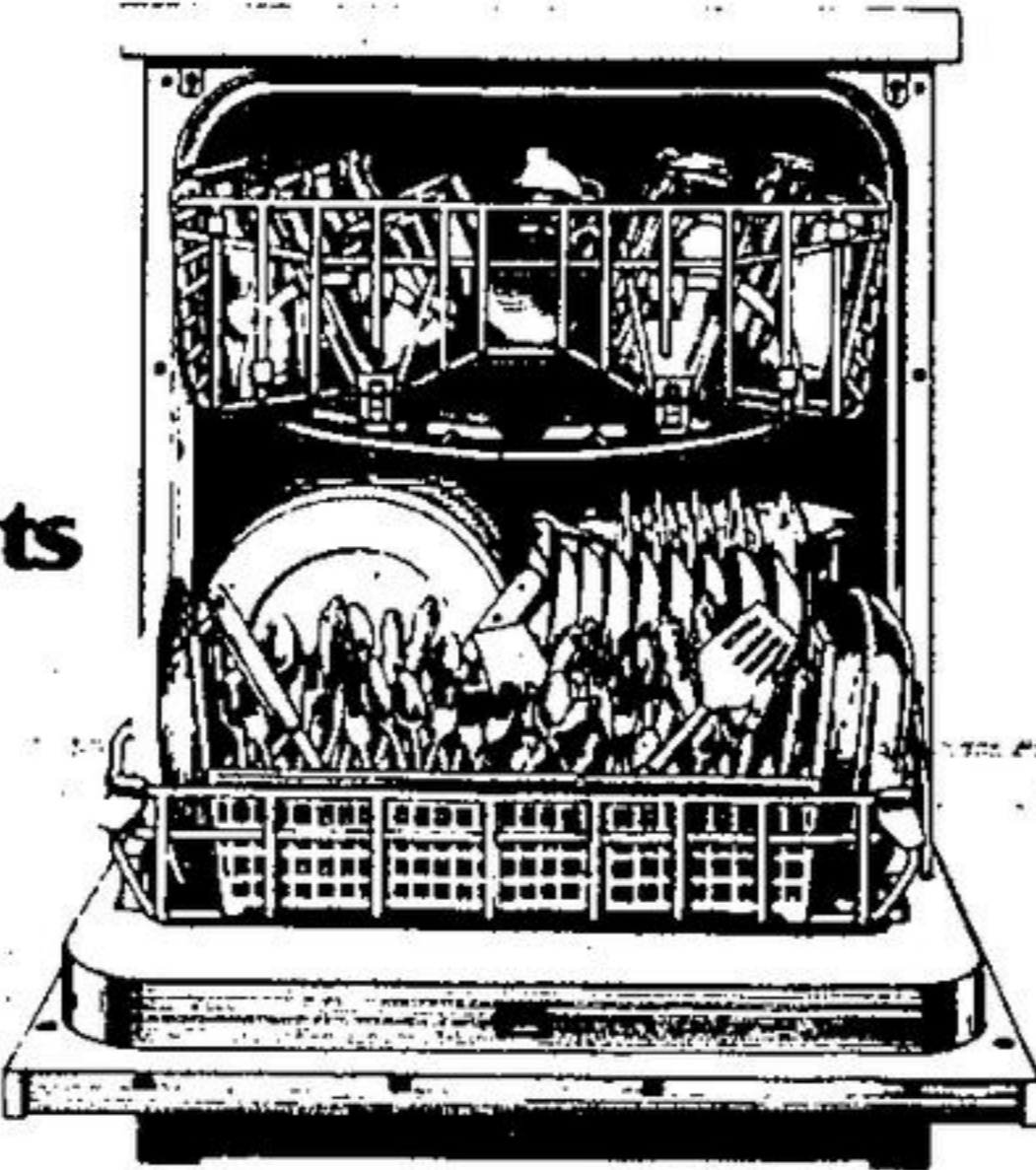
The Matthews appealed the minor variance to the higher authority.
