

Pee-wees improving as season progresses

The Lions started their season off slowly and have been fighting an uphill battle but recently the team is beginning to pull together and the lopsided scores of the early season are disappearing.

Over the past week the Lions put in two solid efforts in splitting games, dropping a closely fought 2-1 decision to Woolwich before unloading on Hespeler 10-4 for their second win of the year.

Sandy Waites was the definite star of the Hespeler match as the young puckster fired six goals while adding an assist. Mike Hudson added a single goal for the Lions while setting up five others, Terry Danagher, Tony Van Dam, and Greg James fired the other

Acton goals in the winning effort while Greg James added the other Lions assist.

"The emphasis on passing paid dividends" said Lions manager Al McKerracher of the second win. "The players are beginning to see the value of what they have been learning at practice. It was their best game yet," he added. Earlier in the year Hespeler scored a 2-1 win over Acton.

In the 2-1 setback to Woolwich it was what McKerracher called their best all round game of the season. "The offense and the defense along with goaltender Steven Taillefer were in top form for the match. Woolwich took an early first period lead in the game and held on to that margin until only 56 seconds remained in the final stanza before moving out to a 2-0 lead.

Acton came right back with their lone goal as Terry Danagher netted the (wine from Robbie West.

In action at the community Centre this Saturday the Lions will try to subdue Elora and the high flying Terry West.

West is one of the sharpest pee-wee shooters in the league and has caused havoc with the Lions netting 11 goals in two previous meetings. "Elora may have West" says Acton coach Barry Incoe. "But we have Waites". Game time at the arena is 3:50 p.m.
