Blows a fuse over blown bulbs

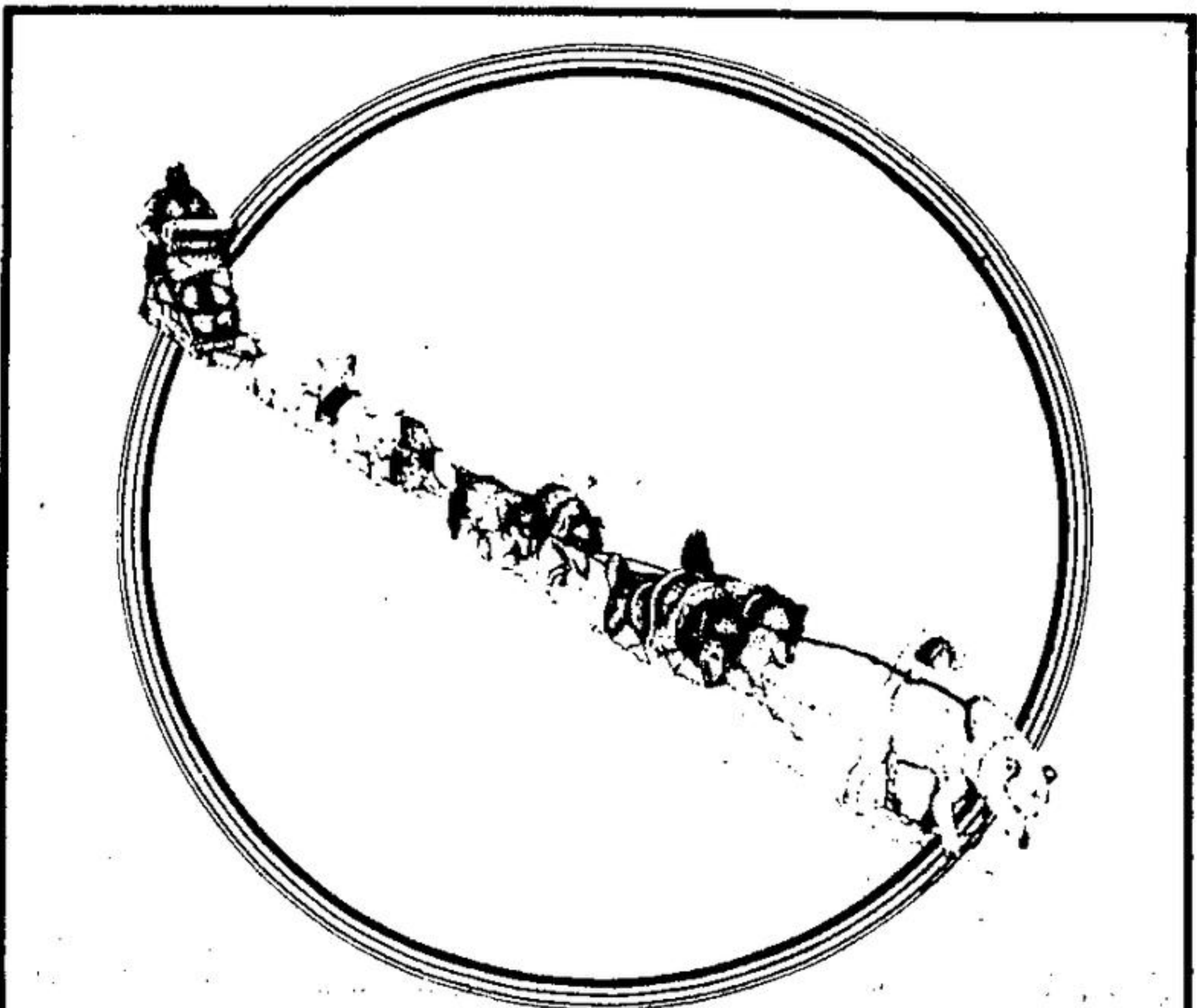
Fred Ruddell and his neighbors on the Fifth Line are really blowing a fuse over blown light bulbs. Since spring of this year, Fred has collected 80 ordinary bulbs and 30 floodlight bulbs that have blown up to now.

He says all the homes on the Fifth Line from 17 Sideroad down to Five Sideroad are affected, with the Hydro knowing about for at least the past four years. "But it's getting worse," said Ruddell.

A week ago Saturday, nine bulbs in his house went within minutes, and two, replaced at that time blew within four days.

Fred claims the voltage ranges between 20 and 130 or more volts. He said some of the neighbors get a shock off their bathtubs.

Ruddell told his newspaper a hydro inspector is supposed to come from Guelph this week to look at the situation again.



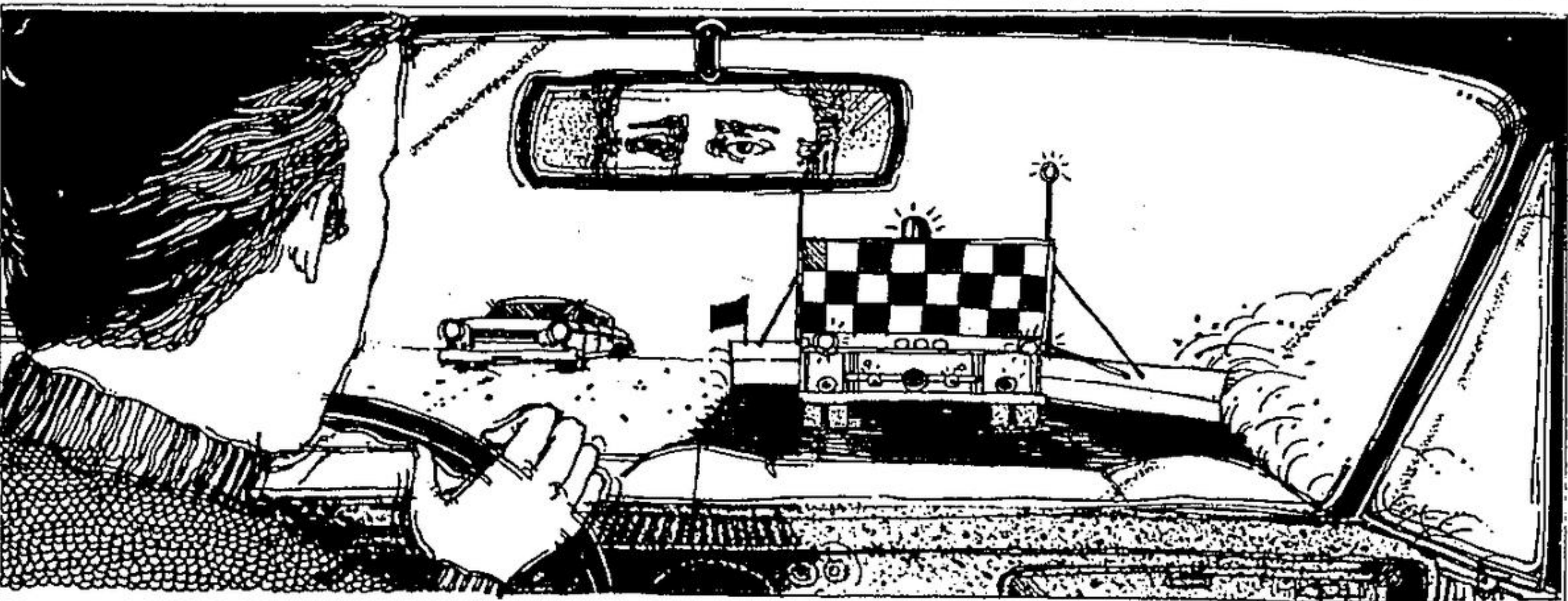
