Fisher captures committee

Acton-Esqueing trustee Betty Fisher took over the chairmanship of one of Halton Board of Education's major committees. Fisher accepted the chair of the staff-board joint committee Thursday at Burlington, during the annual change in chairmanships. According to one board staff member the appointment to such a committee is the first in a long time for a first-term trustee. "I really would like to see more cohesion in opinion between teacher representatives and trustees," Fisher said in an interview after the meeting. Trustee Fisher also indicated she hopes to bring some solutions to the attitudes at committee rather than have both sides agree to disagree. The staff-board committee, a permanent fixture, is perhaps the only outlet where people can talk freely about issues, said the trustee. She also indicated she hopes to defuse some of the anxiety in the relationship between the board and teachers. Fisher, who used to be a member of Halton Hills Library Board, is also on the school board's Library Relations committee, a committee with Halton elementary school teachers and the curriculum wing of the Association of Large School Boards of Ontario. Burlington trustee Cam Jackson won a contest for the chairmanship of the board's salary committee. He beat out another city trustee, Elaine Kiehm, for the job. Kiehm is also a member of the major salary committee. He sits with seven other trustees on the committee which negotiates with teachers. Shepherd indicated he was looking forward to the challenges of the salary committee. Shepherd also holds membership on the community schools administration committee and the advisory committee concerned with trainable retarded children. According to board chairman Bill Herd between three and six committees were dropped by the board for the new year. Burlington trustee Florence Meares won the chairmanship of another heavy board committee—finance. In all, seven trustees sit on that committee. Which is the last superintendent of instruction to have a direct hand in salary negotiations. That aspect of the superintendent's job description was dropped in September and a new job was created. Colin Campbell was appointed to that new job—manager of personnel and employee relations—at the same meeting of the Stouess promotion. The instruction superintendent's job includes responsibility for professional development, supervision, staff promotion, academic personnel and supervision of area superintendents. In early September the board was prepared to announce the appointment of a Superintendent of Instruction, according to an agenda. However, a last minute snag prompted the board with withdraw the item.

Halton picks instruction boss

A new Superintendent of Instruction, Rae Stones, has been appointed by the Halton Board of Education. Stouess, 39, was promoted from the rank of area superintendent in Burlington to the instruction superintendent's position. The board announced the appointment Thursday. The appointment becomes effective at New Year's, when John Boich, who has been Superintendent of Instruction for seven and a half years, leaves to take the executive director's job with the Ontario Association of Education Administrative Officials. Prior to becoming an area superintendent, Stouess was an administrative assistant, principal and vice-principal in Halton. He also was a member of the provincial ministry's Education Relations Allocation System. Halton accepted most of the recommendations from the Special Education Needs Assessment Committee of which Stouess was chairman. That committee work, according to Education Director Em Lavender, was in addition to Stouess' regular duties as principal or area superintendent.

School trustee reports

One year has passed since I was elected as trustee, Halton Board of Education for Wards 1 and 2. It has been a busy year but extremely enjoyable and interesting. During my campaign my main concerns regarding the educational system centered upon a more humane approach to busing, more stress on the basics and a fair but firm discipline structure. Over the course of the year great progress has been achieved in all three areas. One of the main problems in our busing system was that students were travelling inordinate amounts of time on buses to reach their destinations. Many of our routes have now been streamlined to alleviate this problem. Our administration knows that there are basic skills that every child must learn to function within society, those being reading, writing, communication and basic math skills. These skills are now within our core curriculum and are being taught throughout the year. A plan has been devised to isolate these skills and teach them first, thus making the basic skills the "foundation" of our core curriculum. Students would be required to know these skills before pursuing more enriched curriculum. On July 12 the Board passed by unanimous vote a motion to bring forward a discipline policy for all our schools. I brought this motion to the Board because across Ontario discipline problems are escalating and children need consistent but fair standards of discipline to learn and grow. A discipline committee was struck of which I am a member and a detailed discipline policy has been written which will be presented to the Board on January 10, 1980. Looking towards my second year in office, I see many things yet to be done. Relationships between Boards and teachers across Ontario have been tense in the past few years. This severely harms the fibre of our school system—a school system designed for children. We must look for new solutions to this ever increasing problem. Attitudes must change. Undoubtedly the coming years will be very stimulating and productive. In the meantime, I wish you all in Wards 1 and 2 a very Merry Christmas and the Best for the New Year.
