Science Centre — a story book village

Almost overnight, the Great Hall of the Ontario Science Centre has become a storybook village. On its streets, lined with fully-grown Christmas trees, are eight strange and magical visitors. One rolls its big glass eyes and sniffs the ground with its long tin snout—rather like a Little Dragon Carpet Sweeper. Another, a huge tea train that has stopped on its way to Wisteria Halt, quietly puffs graceful billows of white ostrich feathers while its conductor milks a very contented cow!

Just off the main street, 40 wooden dancing dolls, created by toymaker Alex Mulligan, kick up their heels to lively fiddle music. Nearby, toymaker Paul Simpson shows visitors how to make Brazilian Beetles that buzz. Jacob's Ladders that tumble endlessly, puzzles that confuse and cloth dolls that can be cuddled.

In the courtyard, Archie the Frog publicly and shamelessly declares his puppet love for a beautiful princess. From behind the old store windows, he is watched by antique—or at least retired—toys, dolls and games that wait their turn to be admired by visitors.

Outside the village limits in the Main Auditorium of the Science Centre, Dorothy,

Toto, the Tin Man and the Wicked Witch welcome visitors to the 1938 film classic, the Wizard of Oz. Holiday festivities at the Ontario Science Centre begin on December 22nd and, except for Christmas Day, continue to January

1. The Wizard of Oz is screened each day at 11, 1 and 3 p.m.—on December 24 at 11 and 1 only. The Frog Who Wasn't, a puppet show by Frog Print Theatre is presented Boxing Day to January 1 at noon, 1.30, 3 and 4.30 p.m.
