Up licences for non-residents

The Ministry of Natural Resources will increase next year's seasonal fishing licence for non-residents to \$15 from \$10.75, the four-day licence (formerly three-day) to \$8 from \$6 and the licence for other Canadians not resident in Ontario to \$6 from \$4.

"These increases are necessary to help cover rising costs of managing Ontario's fisheries and the cost of inflation," said Natural Resources Minister James Auld.

The increase for non-resident licences, the

first since 1974, will be effective January 1, 1980. Mr. Auld said reports that the ministry would increase the fee for seasonal non-resident

licences during this year to \$35 were inaccurate. The increases are expected to bring in approximately \$2.5 million

Authority permit needed before construction

The Credit Valley Conservation Authority suggests the practical thing to do before buying land near flowing or intermittent watercourses is to check the Fill, Construction and Alteration To Watercourses Regulations.

These regulations state that no person shall:

- construct any building, in any area susceptible to flooding during a regional storm.
 - place or dump fill, in the areas described in the schedules whether such fill is already located in or upon such an area or brought to or on such an area from some other place.
 - straighten, change, divert or interfere in any way with the existing channel of a river, creek, stream or watercourse.
- Anyone planning any of the above must have a permit from the Authority.
- In 1979, Ontario Regulation 211-73 amended by Ontario Regulation 398-79. To notice land owners this statement means little until it actually permits quoted above was directly to them.
