Halton Cable, which puts channels 2 (NBC), 4 basic 13 channel service. doesn't charge an extra fee for its converter channels. Subscribers pay only one monthly fee for both the basic and converter channel services.

Ollivier explained the television CRTC has always said Canadian channels must take priority over American signals on the basic service. He noted the requires once enough ате Canadian stations to fill the basic service the American stations to be bumped to the converter channels.

"We are dedicated to preserving channels 2,4 and 7 on the basic service as long as possible," Ollivier declared.

He noted Halton Cable and other firms have put channel 47, the new multilingual station, on the converter band. station has appealed to the CRTC to force cable companies to put it on basic service and a hearing is pending.

"If Acton High School does not go to double and triple options; kids will be bussed to Georgetown. I'm against that because the subjects are provided (in single options) and can be provided in double triple options," Acton-Esquesing trustee Betty Fisher said after

In addition to offering chances for technical students to gain expertise in subjects, the progress report mentions possible blending of the Halton programs to feed into Sheridan College. Halton students will take six technical credits in a special Halton package

receive equivalent number of hours credit towards

apprenticeships. Today a technical education student, interested in machine shop specialization, may have access to only a single credit survey course, according to the report. The student may end up with a drafting course geared to architecture rather than machines.

Under the recommendations of the report that drafting course would support the machine shop program of the triple credit student while accommodating the student wishing only a single credit.


If Acton were to get a machine shop, the cost would be about \$100,000




