Bray swims for province

Acton swimmer Mark Bray will represent the province of Ontario in a major swim meet in Scarborough this weekend. Bray, who swims with the Guelph Marlins Aquatic Club, will be competing along with 40 others, against a team from Quebec. He earned a spot on the team with his performance in the North York Hall of Fame swim meet held in early December, 1979. Bray warmed up for the competition by copping several first place finishes in an inter-club meet January 5 against Brantford. He won the 400 metre freestyle, the 200 metre butterfly and the 200 metre individual medley, as well as finishing second in the 100 metre backstroke and the 200 metre medley relay. The 13-year-old Acton high school student, is one of three chosen from the Marlins to compete in the meet, which will feature swimmers from 33 Ontario aquatic clubs.
