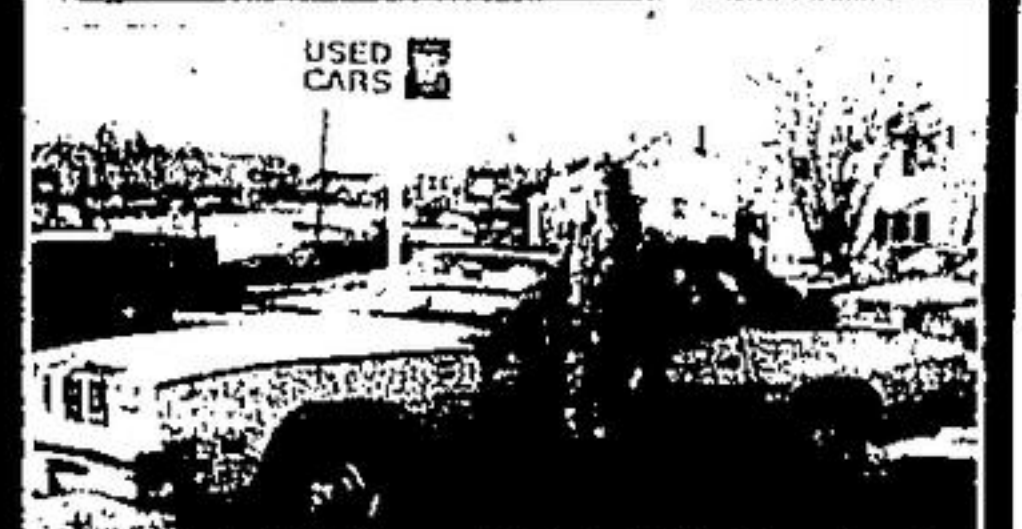

Council air beefs on bylaw

Eramosa township Councillors will take their first close look at the new proposed building bylaw on February 18.

The document, drawn up by building inspector John Salmon, is to be typed up by then, however, councillors aired some views on the most controversial aspects of the new bylaw.

Deputy-reeve Dave Masson urged the dropping of a requirement for citizens to buy a building permit for sheds of less than 1,000 square feet. The bylaw would charge \$10 for such a structure instead of the normal \$25.

"I'm not trying to over-govern," said Mr. Salmon. Deletion of the \$10 limit does not relieve someone from the responsibility of getting a permit, he said.

Mr. Masson later went along with Mr. Salmon's proposals, to ask for a \$300 deposit for permits for single family dwellings. The money is to be refunded when the building construction reaches a certain stage.

Mr. Salmon pointed out that someone who pays the deposit, but fails to start the building, gets the \$300 returned and the cost of the permit, minus a 20 per cent administration fee.

Eramosa asks for industrial zoning

A proposed official plan amendment which could bring a new industry to Rockwood is in the hands of the Guelph and Suburban Planning Board.

Eramosa Township Council Monday asked the board to consider rezoning ten acres south of the village to industrial from agricultural.

Leo Blanchette first proposed moving the company in April.

If Leblanco moves to the site, about a mile south of the village on the east side of Highway 7, it could employ about 36 people. Since the closing of Northern Stag Industries council has been looking for more industrial tax revenue.

Leblanco manufactures commercial food service equipment for hospitals and hotels.

Eight years ago Mr. Blanchette approached council concerning a smaller operation.

Angered by road salt use

A Derry Rd. resident is wondering if the Region of Halton shouldn't go on a salt-restricted road cleaning diet.

Mrs. Roy Bousfield, of Derry Rd. W. Milton, is circulating a letter to all Halton residents asking them to contact Regional Public Works Committee Chairman Ron Planché about what she considers excessive use of road salt.

She noted that in the last two weeks there has been only "a skiff of snow" but the regional works crews were out with the trucks salting the road "when it wasn't needed."

Elections expensive

Not only is an election expensive from the standpoint of the taxpayer, it is also expensive for the candidates.

The three major Halton candidates in the May 22 federal election spent a total of \$59,845.95 on campaign expenses. The three other candidates spent \$4,226.70 for a grand total of \$64,072.65.

Two of the major candidates, Otto Jelinek of the Progressive Conservatives and Doug Black of the New Democratic Party ran in the black at the end of the campaign. So did two of the lesser candidates, Libertarian Karen Selick and Marxist-Leninist Charles Shrybman.

Mr. Jelinek spent \$26,624.34 and received \$29,532.25 in campaign donations.

Mr. Black spent \$7,124.35 and received \$9,275 in contributions.

Miss Selick spent \$583.24 and received \$610 in contributions and Mr. Shrybman spent exactly what he received—\$208.33.

Two other candidates, Liberal Dr. Frank Philbrook and Independent Robert Ritchie, ended up in the red in the campaign.

Dr. Philbrook spent \$26,097.26 but received only \$14,713.43 in campaign donations.

Mr. Ritchie received no campaign donations and spent \$3,435.93 during the campaign.

These expenses were filed with Halton returning officer Joe Anderson.
