Armstrong said Halton Hills is primarily concerned with wayside pit permits, since extensive aggregate mining of wayside pits, especially in the Sixth Line area, has been carried on in the municipality.

The brief recognized the need for the Ministry of Transportation and Communications obtain aggregate at reasonable prices, but said council and residents are alarmed at the impact on adjacent property owners, roads, planning policies, environment and agri-

cultural land use. The brief took issue with a section of Bill 127 which gives the Ministry of Natural Resources the authority to issue a permit, with no regard for local zoning bylaws, and no notification of changes in conditions on the permit issued by the




