# Juniors quell Rebels in tournament

The junior basketball Redmen redeemed themselves for their semi-final loss to Nelson last week, by snatching their sixth tournament crown, in as many tourney outings. Saturday at the annual Rebel Invitational in Georgetown.

It's the second year in a row the juniors have captured the event.

The Redmen reached the finals first by sinking their hosts, Georgetown 52-41 and then downing Aldershot 60-48 in overtime.

One of the juniors' top scorers, Chris Lysholm, was injured in the second match, but he did manage to lead the way in the first victory netting 14

points, while Glenn Van Rijik, who was also injured, and Rob Faber scored 13 and 11 respectively.

Van Rijik scored 21 points and Lysholm counted 15 before both were taken out in the second contest against Aldershot. A strong defensive player, Matt Vuk, was also hurt.

The Redmen were leading with 10 points before the injuries, but with three top shooters out, Aldershot quickly caught up, forcing overtime. Rob Faber was strong defensively and also netted 12 points.

Lysholm sat out the championship match, while Van Rijik and Vuk

played hurt. That didn't stop Vuk however, as he scored 13 points on the Redmen's way to a 60-50 rout over St. Catharines. Dave Entwistle, who's on the Redmen's second string, took up where Vuk left off, leading the scoring with 18 points. Faber scored 13 and was strong defensively.

Van Rijik was chosen for the allstar team while Faber was named the most valuable player of the tournament.

The win gives the Redmen an impressive 34-2 record and six tournament crowns.

Meanwhile senior Redmen were victims of two overtime games in the Stayner Invitational

Saturday, to King City 34-32 and Stayner 38-34.

The seniors experienced troubles with their top player, Martin Osso, out with injuries.

John Vuk led the offense in the first loss with 13 points. Bob McClure netted 11. McClure led the scoring in the second match, while Ken Faber

was top defensive player for the Redmen.

The tournaments mark the end of the Redmen's 1979-80 season.

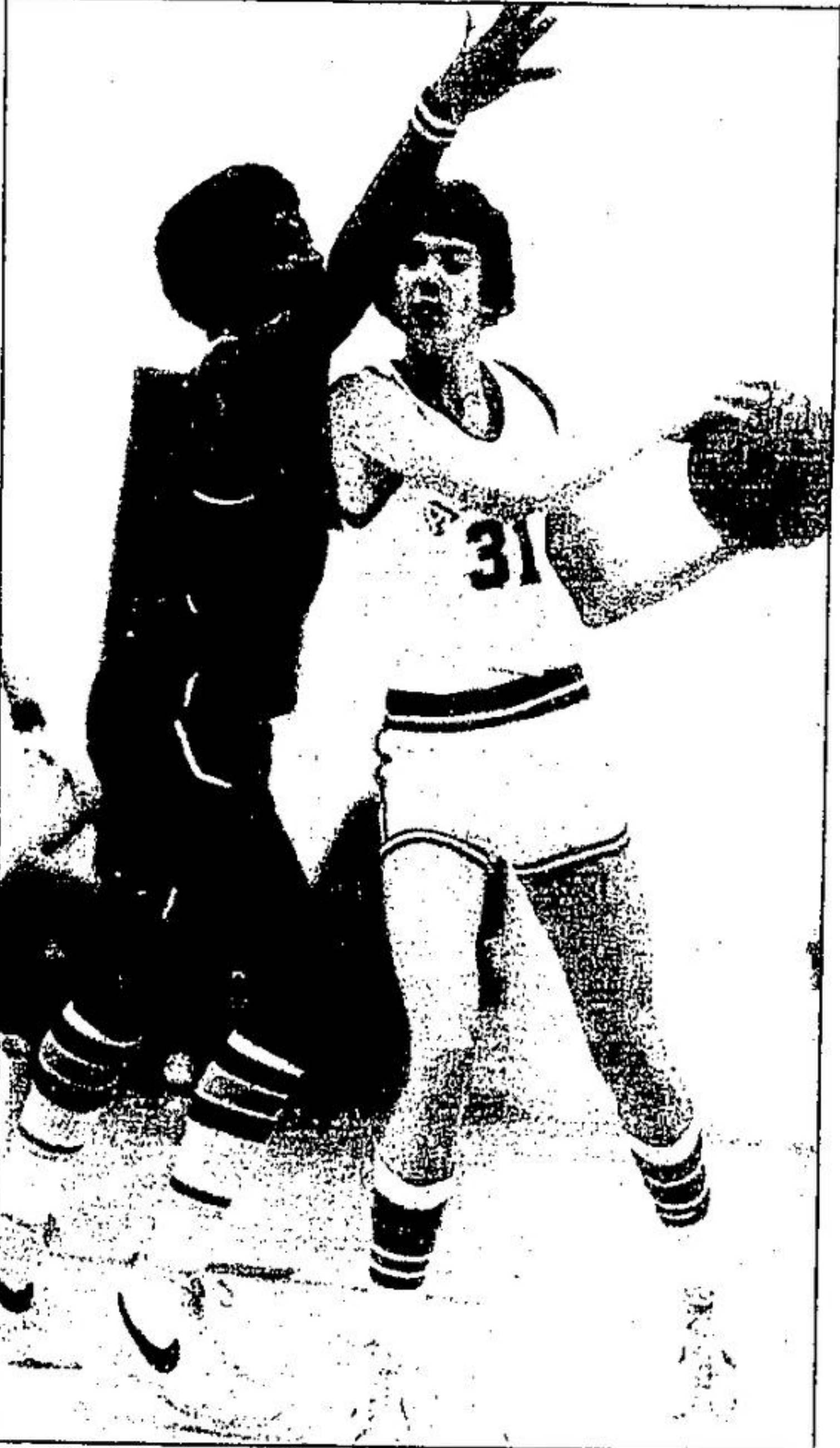
