## Social service grants to be reviewed

The continued future of Halton's social service agencies could well be decided Thursday and Friday.

Members of the Halton Region Health and Social Service Committee have set the two days aside to complete the task of how much money the Region will spend on funding social agencies and organization; and how much each group will get.

So far there are requests for \$683,655 in Regional grant assistance, far more than the \$504,795 given out last year by the Region and the four area municipalities.

The rules of the funding game changed this year with all requests going to Halton Region instead of the split seen in the past.

The amount of money needed, up by about \$180,000, does not include the Regional 10 per cent donation given by the Halton Children's Aid Society.

Of the \$504,795 granted last year, \$110,457 came from Halton and \$394,338 was given out by the four area municipalities. The four supplied the total assistance to housing of \$249,441 in 1979; as under the old system, the region was not responsible for supporting housing assistance.

This year the amount requested is \$255,101.

The greatest increase seen in 1980 is in the general grant area where money is given to groups chiefly in the volunteer sector.

In 1979, the Region gave \$70,774 coupled with the municipalities' \$113,637 for a total of \$184,411. The 1980 request is for \$309,328.

In other areas, the 1980 request for the aged is \$50,134 compared to \$31,448 last year; and the children's sector seeks \$69,092 this year compared to \$39,795 granted in 1979.

In comparison to Oakville and Burlington, the grant requests of Milton and Halton Hills are small. It should be noted requests for grants were sent to the area municipalities, which in turn, have sent them along to the Region.

Halton Hills requests are: Canadian Mental Health Ontario, \$50; Acton Community Services Centre, \$4,950; North Halton Contact Centre, \$2,500; Salvation Army, \$50; and Halton Helping Hands, \$4,000.

Milton's requests are: North Halton Contact Centre, \$500; St. John Ambulance, \$150; Halton Helping Hands, \$1,000; and Boy Scouts, \$1,500.

All groups requesting assistance have been notified and they can be present as the requests are studied.
