Insulation does more than save money

Home insulation will do many things for a house besides reducing heating costs, Brian Coulson of the University of Guelph's Halton Rural Outreach program, told a small audience at Acton Library Thursday night.

Coulson said heating amounts to about 70 per cent of a homeowner's energy bill and insulation will trim that bill anywhere from 20 to 60 per

But insulation will do much more, including enhance comfort, cut drafts, make the house cooler in the summer,-reduce noise from outside, cut the rate of deterioriation of paint and wallpaper, reduce indoor dirt and dust and increase the longevity of the building's fabric, Coulson explained.

He noted the investment people make in insulation will be recovered within five years in reduced energy costs and it will also increase the property




