Splashes of silver for local swimmers

Acton Swimmers brought home three silvers and two bronze medals between them from the Western Region Class II championships in Kitchener-Waterloo recently.

Mark Bray (13-14 boys), contributed 18 points to his club—the Guelph Marlin's cause, with two silver medals in the 100 metre and 200 metre breaststroke, and a bronze in the 400 metre freestyle. Bray also placed fourth in the 1500 metre freestyle and sixth in the 100 metre backstroke.

His brother Peter took home 11 points, all in the freestyle events for boys 10 and under. He finished

second for a silver medal in the 100 metre, and third for a bronze in the 400 metre. He also finished a respectable fifth in the 200 metre freestyle.

Adrienne Kovacs, the third Acton paddler, finished fifth in the 200 metre freestyle, in the girls 10 and under category.

Their club, the Guelph Marlin's, ended up in third spot behind Hamilton-Wentworth and Brantford Aquatic Club.
