Town looking at ways to help BIA secure provincial renewal study funds

Town staff will investigate ways it can help the Acton Business Improvement Area (BIA) secure funds from Queen's Park to study downtown revitalization.

In a presentation to Halton Hills council Monday BIA chairman Larry Greaves noted the province has made money available at low interest rates to study downtown renewal and "it would be unwise for a community to disregard," the aid. He said before the money can be secured the town must have an official plan and a maintenance and occupancy by-law. Acton has an official plan so now the town must enact the maintenance and occupancy by-law Greaves observed, adding such a by-law won't "impose a hardship on anyone."

After that is done the town may initiate a study by "professional architectural-planners-consultants to assess the potential for all aspects of renewal in the next few years." Greaves said the cost of the study would be picked up by Queen's Park and the BIA and municipal costs would be "minimal." Town costs would likely amount to just staff man-hours.

A comprehensive study would include analysis of the strengths and weaknesses of the existing commercial-

retail area, and the land use and redevelopment possibilities. This study would supplement the policies of the Official Plan and involve the town planning department. It would produce new concepts for construction and in-fill to meet market conditions and needs, with input from affected property owners and include the municipality's investment in such facilities as parking, lighting and landscaping.

"We feel the time for such a study is now and the price is right."

To have a maintenance and occupancy by-law a town must have "certain statements" in its Official Plan, clerk-administrator Ken Richardson said. He noted in Ward One the town is still operating under the old Acton Official Plan and it doesn't contain any such

"statements." Richardson noted if the Official Plan did contain the needed "statements" a maintenance and occupancy by-law could be enacted just for the area covered by the BIA.

Council passed a resolution calling for a staff report on all provincial programs for

revitalization of downtowns, including "eligibility criteria," "process requirements" for the municipality, "types of eligible work" for funding and the need for a minimum maintenance and occupancy by-law. The town will also invite an official of the Ministry of Housing to attend a meeting to discuss the

various programs with both Acton and Georgetown and the BIAs of town.

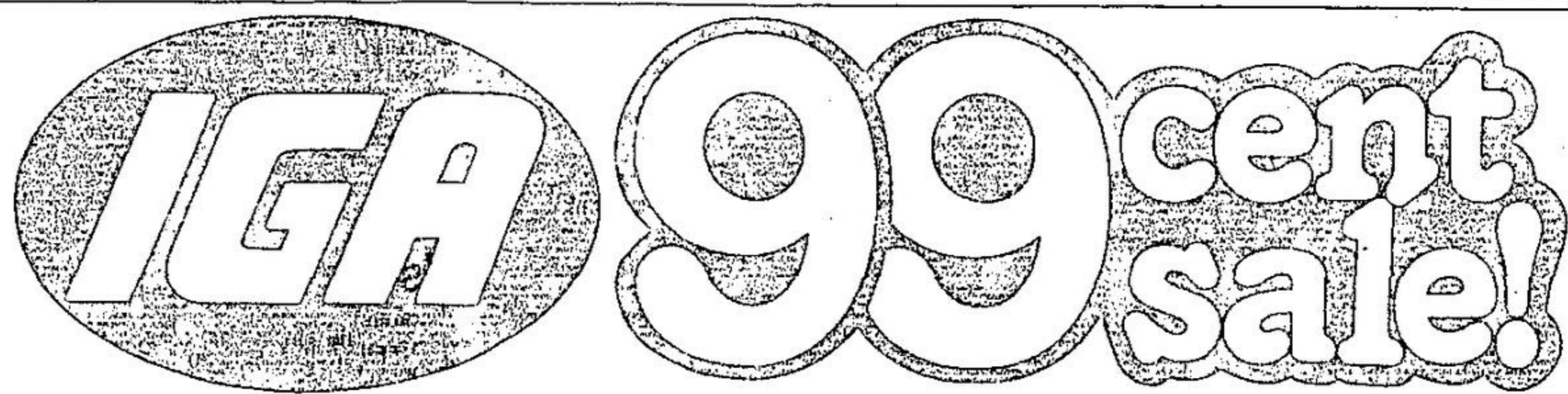

Town writes off \$26,503.86 taxes

Halton Hills council wrote off \$26,503.86 in unpaid taxes Monday night. Of that total \$8,108.35 was for Halton Hills and the remainder was taxes which would have gone to Halton Region, Halton Board of Education and Halton Separate School Board coffers.

Taxes were written off because of tax bill errors, bankruptcy, demolition of property, property destroyed by fire, property which became exempt from taxation,
