The Acton Firefighters were quickly extinguished in Georgetown's annual bantam tournament Monday with two losses to Dixie.

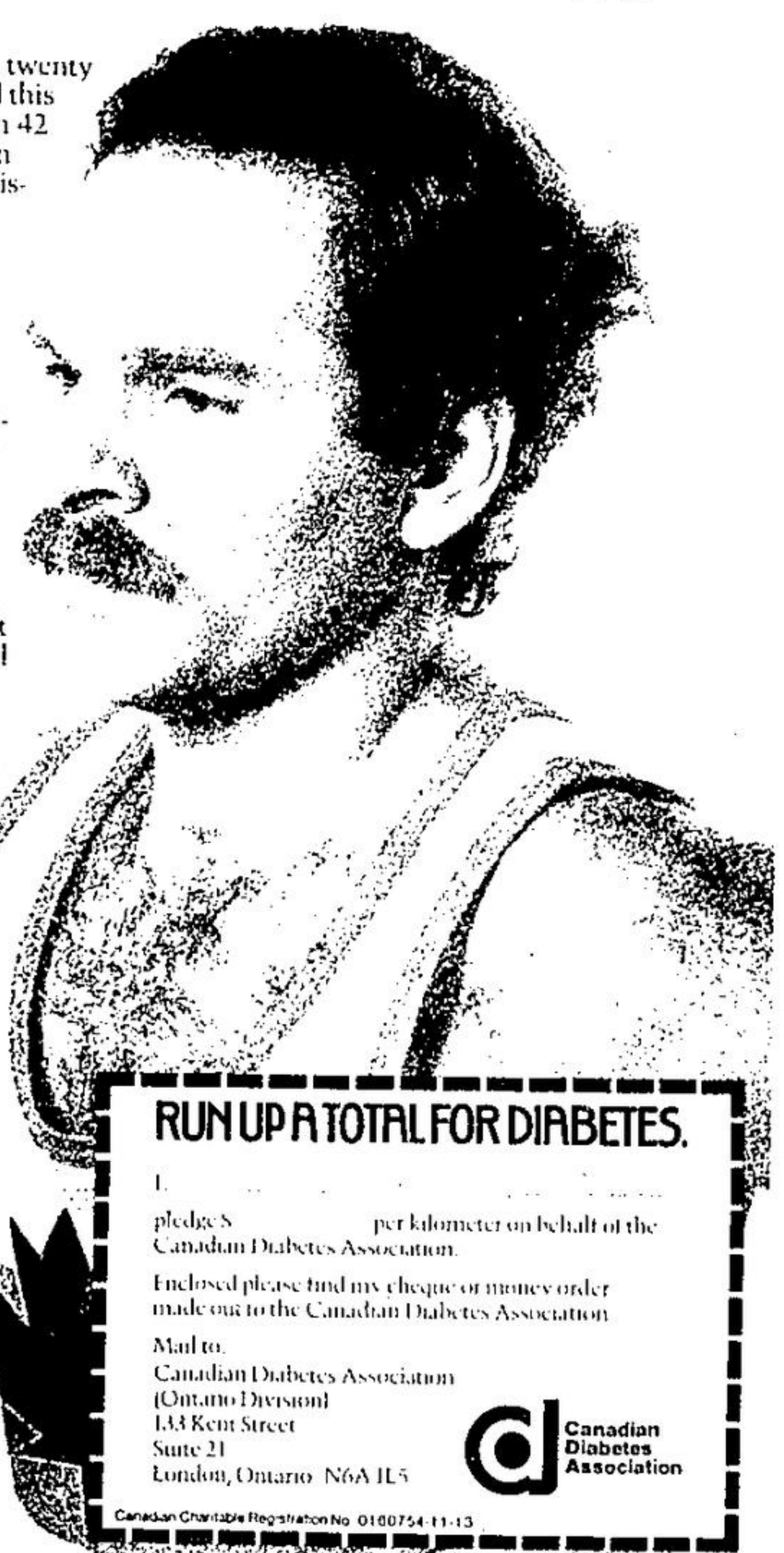
They faced Dixie in the first match at 7:30 a.m. in Georgetown Memorial Arena, losing 10-5.
