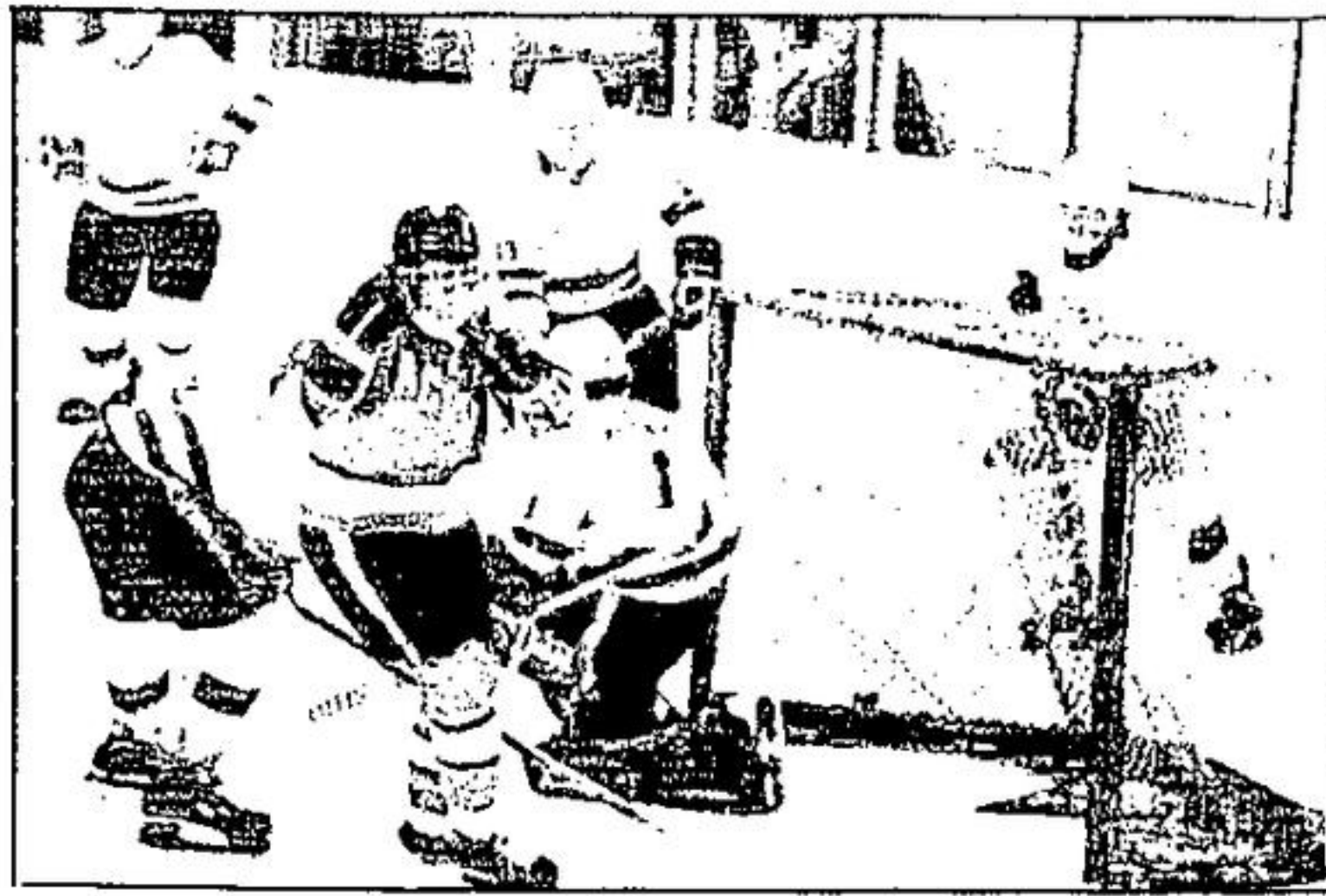


Curling Capers by Karen Archibald
