Vukovich trial postponed

It will likely be another three months before former Acton resident Gail Vukovich goes on trial for one count of first degree murder and two counts of attempted murder.

Mrs. Vukovich is accused of stabbing to death her seven-year-old son Michael last October in Iowa as well as stabbing her other two sons, Matthew, five, and Jonathan, aged four months at the time of the incident.

She appeared in court in January to plead not guilty and was to have gone on trial Monday but a spokesman for the County Attorney's Office said the trial has been continued, with no date set. The spokesman suggested Mrs. Vukovich

won't go on trial for at least another three mon-

She is in custody in the psychiatric ward of St. Francis' Hospital in Waterloo, Iowa, where she continues to undergo psychiatric testing. Mrs. Vukovich is expected to offer an insanity

Dr. Joseph Vukovich, formerly of Glenlea Medical Centre in Acton, moved with his wife Gail and three sons to Iowa last August. The tragic incident occured on his first day of work at Allen Memorial Hospital in Waterloo, Waterloo is a city adjacent to Cedar Falls where the family was living.

The Committee for Better Service (CBS) is trying to arrange a meeting with the new owners of the Erin-Hillsburgh telephone ex-

change. CBS spokesman Ernie Wynne said in a telephone interview Tuesday that the group hopes to meet Bell Canada representatives in June so the company can explain plans for the area.

Bell Canada officially takes over the exchange from the private Com-Telephone munity Company on May 29.

The Ontario Telephone Service Commission's secretary Peter Schofleld confirmed approval of the sale is being allowed by the commission.

Ontario Minister for Transportation and Communications Jim Snow announced the commisalon's decision to the Legislature Friday.




